To consider the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic/Executive Council in approving the recommendations of the Deans' Committee dated 26.08.2015 vide para (A) regarding amendments/additions in existing provisions of Ph.D. Ordinance (**as per Annexure Pages 22(1-2)**)

The consequential amendments in Clause 4, 5, 7.1, 7.8(b), 8.3 to 8.5, 9(a) and 16 of the Ph.D. Ordinance (**as per Annexure Pages 22(4-11)**)

#### **STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

The Deans' Committee in its meeting held on 26.08.2015 has recommended amendment/addition in existing provisions of Ph.D. Ordinance as per UGC Regulations on Minimum Standards and Procedure for the award of M.Phil./Ph.D. Degree Regulations 2009 (**as per Annexure Pages 22(12)**) in the light of the letter received from Additional Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana, Higher Education Department, Chandigarh vide Memo No. 18/80-2015 UNP (4) dated 22.05.2015 directing all the Universities of State to strictly follow the UGC Regulations, 2009 for award of Ph.D. degree. Any deviation from these regulations shall result in punitive action against the university (**as per Annexure Pages 22(3)**). The recommendations of the Deans' Committee dated 26.08.2015 have been approved by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic/Executive Council.

The Deans' Committee in its meeting held on 20.11.2015 reviewing the rules for Ph.D. admission of foreign students in the light of Executive Council Res. No. 7(11) dated 14.09.2015 **has recommended that the International Students may be enrolled for Ph.D. course as per Regulation 2009.** The recommendations of the Deans' Committee have been approved by the Vice-Chancellor.

The Vice-Chancellor while considering the representation of the university college teachers dated 18.11.2015 for supervision of Ph.D. students has ordered that clause-11 of the Ph.D. Ordinance prior to the recommendations of the Deans' Committee dated 26.08.2015 may be adhered to till clarification is received from UGC.

To consider the recommendations of the Deans' Committee dated 20.11.2015 (as per Annexure Pages 23(1-7)) regarding (i) admission of International students to Ph.D.course as per UGC Regulation 2009 and (ii) admission of Sh. Bahram Ramesh, Foreign student to Ph.D. course in the Department of Economics during the session 2014-15.

**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

Deans' Committee in its meeting held on 02.01.2015 vide para (A), recommended "Rules and Procedures for admission to Ph.D. course for International Students" and also recommended provision under clause-05 of Ph.D. Ordinance relaxing the conditions for admission to Ph.D. course of International Students laid down in UGC Regulations 2009 to enhance research activities at international level. The above said recommendations of the Deans' Committee were recommended to Executive Council by the Academic Council vide item No. 30 dated 15.04.2015 (as per Annexure Pages 23(2)).

Chairman of the Department of Economics enrolled Sh. Bahram Ramesh on 27.05.2015 on the basis of above said recommendation of the Academic Council without obtaining any orders/clarification from the higher authorities for his Ph.D. admission. Sh. Bahram Ramesh has deposited Rs. 1,24,654/- (2,000 US Dollars), as per fee structure for foreign students.

The Executive Council in its meeting held on 14.09.2015 vide item No. 07 (11) has not approved the recommendations of the Deans' Committee dated 02.01.2015 and has resolved as under:

"Res. No. 30(A) at Sr.No. 11

To review according to UGC guidelines."

The Deans' Committee in its meeting held on 20.11.2015 after reviewing the above said issues has recommended that the International Students may be enrolled for Ph.D. course as per Regulation 2009. Since, Sh. Bahram Ramesh has been admitted by the Department for Ph.D. admission in Economics, therefore, his Ph.D. admission case with whole facts may be placed before the Academic Council for consideration.

25. To consider the request of Ms. Sapna Saini, Student of DAV College for Girls Yamuna Nagar of BCA 3<sup>rd</sup> year permission to continue her study in BCA 3<sup>rd</sup> year, so that she could complete her Degree.

**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

Ms. Sapna Saini, student of BCA 3<sup>rd</sup> year could not completed the course. As after completion of two year, she could not completed the course, due to not avoidable family circumstances. The relevant rules as per University calendar Vol.-II part-A ordinance of BCA examination semester system clause-8.2 can complete his/her degree with in six years and speak as under:

**“A Candidate who fails to pass all the four semester examination (First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth semesters) within six years of his/her admission to the course shall be required to repeat the course *de novo*.”**

As per above quoted rules she was required to complete her course within six year up to May 2015. The Vice-Chancellor has allowed to complete her degree as special case with in one year with additional fee of Rs. 5000/- in anticipation approval of Academic Council.

Hence the above, proposal.

26. To consider the request of Ms. Neha Walia, Student of Department of Fine Art of MFA 3<sup>rd</sup> semester permission to continue her study in MFA 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, so that she could complete her Degree.

**STATEMENT OF THE CASE:**

Ms. Neha Walia, student of MFA 3<sup>rd</sup> semester could not completed the course. As after completion of two semester, she was selected in NID, Ahmedabad for P.G. Diploma in Ceramic and Glass Design. The relevant rules as per University calendar Vol.-II part-B ordinance of MFA examination semester system clause-9.3 as under:

**“A Candidate who fails to pass all the four semester examination within four years of his/her admission to an MFA course shall be deemed to be unfit for this programme.”**

As per above quoted rules she was required to complete her course within four year up to May 2015. The Vice-Chancellor has allowed to complete her degree as special case with in one year with additional fee of Rs. 5000/- in anticipation approval of Academic Council.

Hence the above, proposal.

27. To consider the request of Sarvshri Vishal Kashyap, Rohit Puri, Kavita, Varun Kumar, Alka of MBA-III and Avinash Chand Sharma and Harjiwan Kaur of MBA (HM)-III for allowing them admission in MBA-III and MBA (HM)-III course, as the case may be in the Directorate of Distance Education during the Academic Session 2015-16 to complete their MBA/MBA (HM) Degree as a special case with existing fees+ Usual late fee, whereas the scheme of MBA-III/MBA (HM)-III year course have been closed.

**Note :-In case the above proposal meets approval of the Academic Council, similar cases if received later will be allowed to complete MBA/MBA (HM)-III during the session 2015-16.**

**STATEMENT OF THE CASE :**

As per Clause 8/8.3 of the Ordinance for MBA/MBA (HM) Examinations (Annual) appearing at page (522-523) and 545 of K.U. Cal. Vol.II, 2014, a candidate is required to complete/pass the Examination within six years of his/her admission to the course, failing which he/she will be required to repeat the course de-novo.

The above candidates took admission in MBA-I/MBA (HM)-I in the Directorate of Distance Education in the session 2011-12 and 2012-13 respectively and are required to pass the course within six years i.e. upto May/June, 2016-17 and 2017-18. But the scheme of MBA-III year and MBA (HM)-III year course have been closed from the session 2015-16. Now they have requested to allow them to take admission in MBA-III and MBA (HM)-III in the Directorate of Distance Education to complete their MBA/MBA (HM) Degree course during the session 2015-16 as a special case.

Hence the above.
