Brief particulars of the agenda items for the Academic Council meeting to be held on 9.01.2018

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KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, KURUKSHETRA

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Agenda for the 120th meeting of the Academic Council of the Kurukshetra University to be held on Tuesday, the 9th January, 2018 at 3.30 p.m. in the Senate Hall, Bhagvadgita Sadan, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

1. To confirm the minutes of the last meeting of the Academic Council held on 18.05.2017; and to note the follow up action as per **Annexure pages 1(1-5)**.

2. To consider the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of the Academic Council in approving the recommendations of the Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to consider the passing scheme of private students UG/PG at par with the passing scheme of students of Distance Education to avoid delay in the declaration of results.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

For considering the proposal for keeping the passing scheme of private students at par with the passing scheme of students of Distance Education, the Vice-Chancellor had constituted a Committee consisting of following members:

1. Dean Academic Affairs
2. Dean, Arts & Languages
3. Dean, Examination Affairs
4. Dean, Faculty of Law
5. Dean, Faculty of Commerce & Management
6. Director, Distance Education
7. Controller of Exams-I
8. Controller of Exams-II
9. Deputy Registrar (Academic)

The above Committee in its meeting held on 10.04.2017 in the Office of the Dean Academic Affairs recommended as under:

At the outset the Committee was apprised that the Syllabus and Scheme of Examination of all students appearing as private candidates as well as through Distance Education mode is the same. The students of both these categories appear in the examination simultaneously and their question papers and marks are the same. The result of private candidates and the students of Distance Education is also declared simultaneously. The following pass marks are required in the case of private candidates:

- 35% in each theory paper**
- 35% in practical/project work/viva-voce**
- 35% in the aggregate of theory & sessional marks/practical subject**

Recently as per Notification No. DDE/S-II/DE-IA/17/1007-1025 dated 07.03.2017 an amendment has been made with regard to passing Scheme of Distance Education students. Now it has been decided that the result of all the candidates of all the courses having internal assessment being run in the Directorate of Distance Education of the University will be computed after aggregating the marks obtained by the candidates in theory papers and the Internal Assessment w.e.f. the session 2016-17:

- 35% in each theory/practical including internal assessment**
- 35% in the aggregate**

After detailed discussion and keeping in view the fact that, the scheme of examination/syllabus of private candidates as well as of distance education students is the same, the Committee unanimously recommends that the pass marks may be revised at par with the students appearing through Distance Education & the result of private students may also be compiled by taking internal assessment & theory marks collectively on the pattern of students appearing through Distance Education.

Passing scheme for U.G. and P.G. courses in Distance Education is as under:

-UG-35% in each theory/practical including internal assessment in the aggregate

-PG-40% in each theory/practical including internal assessment in the aggregate

As the meeting of the Academic Council was not likely to be held soon, the above recommendations were approved by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of the Academic Council.

Swamy in MBA-III, Course in the Directorate of Distance Education during the Academic Session 2016-17 to complete his MBA Degree as a special case with existing fees+ Usual late fee, whereas the scheme of MBA-III year course has been closed.

STATEMENT OF THE CASE

As per Clause 8 of the Ordinance for MBA Examinations (Annual) appearing at page (523) of K.U. Cal. Vol. II, 2014 a candidate who fails to pass the whole Examination (Part- I,II,III) within six years of his /her admission to the course shall be required to repeat the course, de-novo.

The above candidate took admission in MBA-I in the Directorate of Distance Education in the session 2011-12 and was required to pass the course within six years i.e. upto May/June,2016-17. But the scheme of MBA-III year course has been closed from the session 2015-16. Now he has requested to allow him to take admission in MBA-III in the Directorate of Distance Education to complete his MBA Degree course during the session 2016-17as a special case.

2. Fresh Medals/Prizes be instituted with at least the amount of ₹ 2,00,000/- as Endowment Fund, as already approved by the Executive Council vide its Resolution No. 3 dated 31.10.2013 in the case of Institution of Scholarship.”

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

A Committee was constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to consider the issue regarding reduction of day-to-day rate of interest by the Banks on the amount received as Endowment Fund. The Committee considered the issue and was of the opinion that since the value of the Scholarships/Medals/Prizes is more than the interest earned on the FDRs, hence it is not possible to make the payment of the Scholarships/Medals/Prizes out of the interest accrued on the endowment fund as per list “**Annexure Pages 12(1-4)**”. The Committee also noted that in some cases, the donors were requested to enhance the principal amount of donated Fund, but neither they showed any interest to increase the principal amount nor replied.

Now, both the teachers got reinstated by the Director General, Higher Education Haryana, Panchkula on the basis of work and conduct report sent by the Principal during the last 15 years. They have also made a joint representation to this University to reinstate them for examination duties. Accordingly, after making a draft item of the same, the item was placed before the Academic Council in its meeting held on 10.12.2015 but the same was deferred at that time. A Committee was constituted by the worthy Vice-Chancellor later on under the Chairmanship of the Dean of Colleges to reconsider the matter of the said teachers. The Committee after perusal of the case and going through the written comments of both the teachers, it has been decided that the ban for performing examination duty may be revoked and they may be allowed to perform examination duty in future.

No. 14(8) of 29.12.2016 containing the provisions regarding duration of the course, minimum eligibility conditions, criteria for award of internal assessment, attendance requirement, chances to clear the re-appear papers/exams., medium of instruction and examination, pass percentage, award of division etc., the office instead of getting approved the new Ordinance for B.Ed. (Spl. Ed.) (Hearing Impairment) course, has made amendments in the various clauses of the existing Ordinance by adding the name of the course at appropriate clauses so as to make it common for both the examinations i.e. B.Ed. Sikar Rajasthan of Shri Jaiveer F/o Ms. Sheetal of Bhiwani having passed the above said course, who is now the student of M.Sc. Chemistry (Non-Math) of this university; Chairperson, Department of Chemistry, K.U.K has forwarded his recommendations on the prescribed proforma (**as per Annexure Page 31(1)**) regarding recognition of B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry 3 Years Degree of Mody University of Science & Technology, Lakshmangarh, Distt. Sikar, Rajasthan as equivalent to B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry 3 Years Degree of this university is as under:

“Three members committee comprising members from three branches (inorg, phy, Org) was constituted and committee is of the view that more than 80% Syllabus of B.Sc. (Hons.Chem.) of Mody University of Science and Technology is similar to Kurukshetra University. In view of that I recommended equivalence of the course.”

In this regard a meeting of Equivalence Committee was held on 7.09.2017 and Committee also endorse the above recommendations.

Accordingly, the meetings of the Committees were held on 01.08.2017 at 3:00 PM and 4:00 PM, 02.08.2017 at 3:00 PM and 22.08.2017 at 3:30 PM respectively to explore the possibilities for introduction of above said courses and also to discuss the several points i.e. duration of course, eligibility conditions, medium, fees, no. of subjects, theory & Practical, Syllabus and Scheme etc. After detailed discussion in meetings, the Committees constituted for the purpose have recommended that the above said courses may be introduced through distance mode from the session 2018-19. All the proceedings (**as per Annexure Pages 34(3-10)**) containing the recommendations of the committee for introduction of the courses have been approved by the Vice-Chancellor vide his orders dated 26.09.2017 at NP-6 ante (**as per Annexure Pages 34(11)**).

The Executive Council vide its Res. No. 14 dated 24.07.2017 has adopted the above mentioned letter dated 24.05.2017 of the State Government.

In view of the above, the Vice-Chancellor constituted the following Committee to suggest amendments/additions in Statutes 8, 10, 12, 17, 20, 26, 27 and 28 and Ordinance-VI A concerning Constitution and Functions of the Staff Councils and/or Departmental Committees in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes:

The above Committee in its meetings held on 21.08.2017 and 15.09.2017, after detailed deliberations, has recommended the above

amendments/additions in Statutes 12, 17, 20, 26, 27 and 28 and Ordinance-VI A concerning Constitutions of the Academic Council; Faculties; appointment of Chairperson/Director; list of Departments/Institutes/ Schools; assignment of Department/Institute/School of Studies to Faculties and Constitution of Board of Studies and Constitution and Functions of Staff Councils/Departmental Committees in the UTDs/Institutes respectively. The amendment/addition in Statute 8 of the K.U. Act concerning Constitution of the Court, as recommended by the above mentioned Committee, are being placed before the Court separately.

The Director, UIET forwarded a draft MoU to be entered between UIET, K.U.K. and NIELIT, Kurukshetra with regard to organization of Professional, summer training and Project based computer training Programmes at UIET, K.U.K. A committee was constituted by the University to examine the proposed MoU. As per Clause 7.4 of the Ordinance for M.Sc. Computer Science (SW) Final Examination, appearing at page 190 of K.U.Cal.Vol.II, (Part-A) 2003, a candidate who fails to pass M.Sc. Computer Science (SW) final examination within a period of four years of his/her admission to the course shall be deemed to be unfit for the course.

In the instant case Mr. Parveen Goel took admission in M.Sc. Computer Science (Previous) first time during the session 2013-14 but could not complete the course within stipulated period. Now he has requested to allow him to take admission in M.Sc. Computer Science (SW) final in the Directorate to complete his degree course during the session 2017-18. The Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council allowed admission to him in M.Sc. Computer Science (SW) final through DDE as a special case with extra fee of Rs.5000/- in addition to normal fee/late fee etc.

The Academic Council has already allowed admission to some candidates also to complete their Degree course as a special case on one or the other ground with the penalty of Rs. 5000/- in addition to normal fee/dues for permitting them extension of **one year** beyond four years which is the stipulated period for passing M.A./M.Com. Degree Course.

Hence the above.

To consider the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council in allowing regularization of admission to Mr. Rajdeep Singh in M.A. English (Final) in the Directorate of Distance Education to appear in the examination to be held in May/June, 2018 to complete his degree as a special case with extra fee of Rs. 5000/- in addition to normal fee/late fee etc. for permitting him extension of one year beyond 4 years which is stipulated period for passing M.A. English (Final).

STATEMENT OF THE CASE:

As per Clause 8.3 of the Ordinance for M.A. English (Final) Examination, appearing at page 328 of K.U. Calendar. Vol.II, (Part-B) 2014, a candidate who fails to pass M.A. examination within a period of four years of his/her admission to the course shall be required to pursue the course ab initio if he/she desires to pass the course after the time limit. In the instant case Mr. Rajdeep Singh took admission in M.A. English (Previous) during the session 2009-10 and was required to complete the course upto 2013-14 but could not complete the course within stipulated period. Now he has requested to allow him to take admission in M.A. Final (English) in the Directorate to complete his degree course during the session 2017-18. The Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of the approval of the Academic Council allowed admission to him in M.A. English (Final) through DDE as a special case with extra fee of Rs.5000/- in addition to normal fee/late fee etc.

The Academic Council has already allowed admission to some candidates also to complete their Degree course as a special case, on one or the other ground with the penalty of Rs. 5000/- in addition to normal fee/dues for permitting them extension of one year beyond four years which is the stipulated period for passing M.A./M.Com. Degree course.
