Scheme of Question Paper

Note: The question paper will carry 40 marks.

Q.1. There will be six short answer type questions on *Lord of the Flies* based on important characters, situations, setting, plot, symbols, images, themes and motifs in the novel. The candidates will be required to answer four questions.
