विश्वविद्यालय प्रेस विश्वविद्यालय अनुदान आयोग की आर्थिक सहायता से सन् 1964 में शुरू किया गया था और यह विश्वविद्यालय का समस्त मुद्रण कार्य कुशलतापूर्वक पिछले 53 वर्षों से कर रहा है। प्रेस में सुसज्जित लैटर प्रेस व आफसैट प्रिंटिंग, डीजिटल प्रिंटिंग, जिल्दसाजी एवं कम्पोजिंग विभाग हैं जिनमें निम्नलिखित उपकरण उपलब्ध हैं।

विश्वविद्यालय के विभिन्न विभागों/शाखाओं के समयबद्ध कार्यों के अतिरिक्त प्रेस वार्षिक प्रकाशन मुद्रित करता है; उदाहरणतया: जरनल आफ हरियाणा स्टडीज, रिसर्च जरनल आफ आर्ट्स एण्ड हुमेनिटीज, लॉ जरनल, सम्भावना, डाईजैस्ट आफ इंडोलोजिकल स्टडीज, यूनिवर्सिटी कैलेंडर, वार्षिक रिपोर्ट, विद्यार्थियों की पत्रिकायें, सब प्रकार के प्रोस्पैक्टस (विवरण-पुस्तिकाएं), पाठ्यक्रम, स्नातक स्तर की पाठ्य पुस्तकें, दूरवर्ती शिक्षा निदेशालय के पाठ इनके अतिरिक्त समस्त सामान्य पुस्तकें और विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा प्रकाशित पुस्तकें भी विश्वविद्यालय प्रेस में मुद्रित होती हैं। विश्वविद्यालय प्रेस में उपलब्ध सुविधाओं को बी.टेक. प्रिंटिंग, ग्राफिक्स एवं पैकेजिंग कोर्स, जनसंचार कोर्स, फाईन आर्ट्स विभाग आई.टी.आई. गुल्हा, के छात्रों को प्रेक्टिकल निर्देश देने के लिए प्रयोग किया जा रहा है। इसके इलावा ऐपरेटींसशिप स्कीम के अन्तर्गत बाईंडिंग व प्रिंटिंग मशीन में भी प्रशिक्षण प्रदान किया जा रहा है।

प्रकाशन ब्यूरो

विश्वविद्यालय ने अपना प्रकाशन ब्यूरो स्नातक कक्षाओं के लिये कम कीमत पर पाठ्य पुस्तकों को प्रकाशित करने के उद्देश्य से सन् 1975 में आरम्भ किया था। प्रकाशन ब्यूरो बाद में विश्वविद्यालय के प्रेस के साथ मिला दिया गया और प्रिंटिंग प्रेस और प्रकाशन ब्यूरो मैनेजर, मुद्रण एवम् प्रकाशन विभाग के अधीन सन् 1978 में बना। लगभग 60 पाठ्य पुस्तकें अंग्रेजी, हिन्दी, संस्कृत और पंजाबी में प्रकाशित की गईं और उनमें से कुछ विश्वविद्यालय प्रेस में पुनर्मुद्रित हुई हैं। पाठ्य-पुस्तकों के अतिरिक्त प्रकाशन ब्यूरो विद्यार्थियों, पंजीकृत पुस्तक विक्रेताओं की आवश्यकताओं की पूर्ति करता है तथा कीमत वाले प्रकाशनों की बिक्री व्यवस्था करने जैसे प्रवेश फार्म, प्रोस्पैक्टस (विवरण पुस्तिका) परीक्षा फार्म, पाठ्यक्रम, पाठ्य-पुस्तकें, छात्रावास नियमावली आदि के द्वारा आवश्यकताओं की पूर्ति करता है।

विश्वविद्यालय प्रकाशन ब्यूरो ने विभिन्न विषयों जैसे संस्कृत, प्राच्य विद्या, इतिहास, गणित तथा शिक्षा आदि से सम्बन्धित विद्वान शिक्षकों द्वारा रचित 47 पुस्तकें भी प्रकाशित की हैं। कर्मचारियों के सत्प्रयासों तथा कार्यकुशलता के फलस्वरूप और सभी सम्बद्ध पक्षों के सहयोग से ब्यूरो की कार्य प्रणाली में हर वर्ष सुधार हो रहा है।

In terms of Section 14(2) of the K.U. Act 1986, University Budget and its Annual Accounts are put up to the "Court" every year for consideration. Accordingly, the 'Court' in its meeting held on 31.03.2017 considered and approved the Budget Estimates for the year 2017-2018. Revised Estimates for the year 2016-17 including Actuals for the year 2015-2016 as recommended by the Executive Council and the summary of the Budget so approved is given below:-

In the meeting of the Executive Council held on 22.02.2017, the Council discussed the financial position of the University in detail and observed that the State Government be requested to release more funds to strengthen the financial position of the University. Accordingly as per decision of the Executive Council the State Government has already been requested to provide additional grant to meet the expenditure of the University.

The High Powered Co-ordination Committee in its meeting held on 27.04.1994, Inter alia, resolved that the University should augment its internal resources so generated be used on developmental activities and that State

Government will not take into account the increased internal resources generated by the University while determining the quantum of grant-in-aid to be paid to the University. In pursuance of this decision, the University has been generating additional income from 1994-95 onwards by taking various innovative measures like conduct of admission entrance tests, supporting job-oriented courses through the Directorate of Distance education etc. besides increasing internal income in the traditional areas like tuition/examination fees etc. The income so generated is being kept apart under a separate Budget Head 'Self Financing Schemes' for undertaking research and development activities in terms of HPCC decision. Accordingly, the University has also been providing liberal grants to various University Teaching Departments for which provision of Rs. 10.00 lac under the Budget Head "I.T. Infrastructure Development", Rs.10.00 lac under the Budget Head I.T. Infrastructure WiFi/Networking/ Surveillance/ Website and also to make available readers/researchers.

With the help of resources so generated and also partly financed by the State Government/UGC/ Government of India, the University has been able to take up the construction of prestigious buildings like:

Apart from the above construction works, various other construction works have been undertaken.

In its endeavour to raise the resources further, University has also been shouldering the responsibility of the State Government in taking up the various research developmental activities out of the resources generated by the University. With the strenuous efforts of the Accounts Branch, 124 numbers of audit objections, requisitions and audit paras have been got dropped from the Audit during the year 2017. Besides this provisional payments of ` 355.94 lac and temporary advances of Rs. 1470.73 lac from April, 2017 to December, 2017 have also been got adjusted. Periodicals meetings are also being held with the concerned Officers to expedite the pending audit objections etc.

By way of regulating and monitoring regularly the income/disbursements under the Provident Fund Account, investment of balances available were made with various Banks on competitive rates of interest whereby the University has been able to maintain the rate of interest of PF accumulations to its employees at 7.60% per annum as per instructions of the State Govt. from time to time.

To keep pace with the all-round development in various fields of academic, research and developmental activities, the UGC has approved grant of Rs. 15.79 crore under General Development Assistance Scheme for the XII Plan period i.e. from 01.04.2012 to 31.03.2017. Out of this grant of Rs. 15.79 crores, the UGC has released 60% grant (Rs. 2,37,50,000/- during the financial year 2012-2013 & Rs. 3,94,10,000/- during the financial year 2013-2014 and Rs. 3.15 crore during the financial year 2016-2017) so far. The UGC is also releasing grant for Women Studies Research Centre, Gandhian Studies Centre, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Studies Centre, and also for organization of Orientation/Refresher Courses etc. which is over and above XII Plan allocations. In addition to above, Major and Minor Research Projects are also being run with the assistance of the UGC. In some teaching Departments special assistance programmes are also being run with 'UGC' assistance over and above XII Plan allocation. The UGC has also approved a grant of Rs. 1,65,00,000/- under Development of Sports infrastructure and Equipment in Universities (Plan) out of this the UGC has released a amount of Rs. 82,50,000/-. Now the UGC XII Plan period has been over on 30.9.2017.

PLACEMENT CELL

University has Placement Cell, which facilitates the placement activities of the students pursuing professional, as well as traditional streams of education in the campus. The Various activities of the Placement Cell are as under:

1. **Academia-Industry Interface:** - The Placement Cell organizes Executive Meets/Interaction Programs in collaboration with the Industry. Three such programs were organized in the reporting year in association of Piramal Foundation and Tata Teleservices Pvt. Ltd. About 450 students participated in these programmes.
2. **Employment Information:** - The Placement Cell provides job related information to the students. This information is displayed on the notice board of the Placement Cell and also on the central notice board placed at Indian Cafe house. The information is also circulated to the concerned departments/Institute for the information of students.
3. **Personality Development:** - Placement Cell organizes programs aimed at overall personality development of the university students. These programmes imbibe essential soft skill in the students and enhance their employability.
4. **Career Guidance and Counseling:** - The Placement Cell also provides career guidance to the students for the better employment. The cell helps the students to prepare for different stages of recruitment and selection drive such as resume-writing, group discussions, mock interview etc. The cell organizes short-term workshop/ programmes for this purpose. Six such programmes were organized in reporting year and around 1100 students attended these programmes.
5. **Entrepreneurship Development:** - The Placement Cell organizes short Entrepreneurship Development programmes to motivate the students for entrepreneurship and self-employments. These programmes are organized in association with PHD Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Chandigarh and Piramal Foundations, Jaipur (On.18-19 Jan.2017). In reporting years around 1250 students have participated in these programmes.
6. **Campus Placement Drives:** - The Placement Cell coordinates/organizes interviews for university students and more so for the students of professional courses. About 90 companies/organization like IBM, Wipro, Infosys, Adani, Siegwark India Pvt. Ltd., SBI, ONGC, Vardhman Textiles, Denso Haryana, Barti Airtel, Tata Teleservices, ICICI Bank, Cairn India, Axis Bank, Jubilant Organics, Tirupati Life Sciences etc. recruited the students and more than 500 students have been placed at different levels. The salary offered to these students ranges between Rs. 2.5 lacs to Rs. 6.00 lacs per annum.

RESEARCH AND INNOVATION

Multi-faculty research in the university is focused mainly on :-

Low energy ion beam based research, metal and nonmetal particles characterization, earth resources exploration, exhumation of lithospheric crust, synthesis of semiconductors.

Bioremediation, genetic engineering and transformation, enhanced resistance to pathogens, molecular modeling, antimicrobial activities. evaluation of enzymes.

Welfare policies for scheduled casts and scheduled tribes, multidimensional analysis of social exclusions, pattern of woman employment in Haryana, female foeticide, socio-economic surveys, etc.

Since inception, the University has strived to be an acknowledged Centre of academic excellence and research standards of international repute concomitant to its inherent mission of producing highly trained, skilled and globally competitive manpower.

Realizing the need to constrain research emphasis in the University, and in order to attain research distinction at national and eventually at global level, a separate Research and Development wing was put in place about fifteen years ago, wherein teachers are encouraged to formulate and submit more and more Research Projects to the external funding agencies.

As a consequence of above drive, the University Teaching fraternity has completed and got sanctioned 102 Major Research Projects amounting to Rs. 67/- Crores (Rupees Sixty-Seven Crores) during the last three years.

Research outcome of these Projects is published in SCI journals and is also presented at international Conferences e.g. during the last two years about 40 University teachers have presented their Research Papers in the International Conferences held world over almost in all the continents of the world.

Also at International Conferences, University Professors earn distinction by chairing multiple sessions in conferences.

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the University was established in 1995 and since then working towards the realization of the goals of Quality enhancement and sustenance. It continuously strives to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic action to improve the academic and administrative performance of the University. The aim is to channelize all efforts and measures of the University towards promoting 'Quality Culture' leading to holistic academic excellence.
