**ORDINANCE—B.Sc.B.Ed./B.A.B.Ed.(4-YEAR INTEGRATED COURSE) EXAMINATION
(SEMESTER SYSTEM)**

(w.e.f. admissions of 2018-19)

1. The duration of the course of instruction for award of **B.Sc.B.Ed./B.A.B.Ed.** Degree shall be four academic years, comprising of Eight Semesters including school based experience and Internship. Each academic year shall be divided into two Semesters i.e. July to December and January to May/June.

1.1 Examinations for the First, Third, Fifth and Seventh Semesters shall be held in December/January and for the Second, Fourth, Sixth and Eighth Semesters in May/June.

1.2 The dates of examination fixed under above clause shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations to all concerned.

2. The last date(s) by which examination forms and fees must reach the Examination Enquiry shall be as per schedule at Appendix-I in K.U. Cal. Vol.II.

3. A candidate who has passed Senior Secondary Certificate Examination (10+2 Standard) from the Board of School Education, Haryana or its equivalent examination with atleast 50% marks in aggregate (47.50 marks ($5/100 \times 50 = 2.50$) in case of SC/ST/PWD candidates) shall be eligible to join First Semester of the course.

Note: (1) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.

(2) Candidates placed under compartment/re-appear in the qualifying examination shall not be allowed admission to the Course.

(3) No student admitted to B.Sc. B.Ed./B.A.B.Ed. Programme of the university, shall be permitted to study simultaneously in any other course leading to a degree offered by this/any other university.

(4) No student will be allowed to appear in this course if he/she is in employment-permanent or temporary.

4. A candidate who has passed the Semesters I and II or III and IV or V and VI from this University shall be eligible to join the Semester III, V and VII respectively of the course. This is, however, subject to the provisions made under clause 8.

5. The examination shall be held according to the scheme and syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate, who fails in an examination, or having been eligible, fails to appear in an examination, shall, unless approved otherwise by the Academic Council, take the

examination as an ex-student according to the scheme and syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.

5.1 The examination shall consist of: -

- (a) Written Papers: Written papers will be got set as per University norms.
- (b) Practical Examinations: Examinations in practical shall be conducted and evaluated by the External Examiner as recommended by the Board of Studies.
- (c) School Internship : as per scheme of examination.
- (c) 20% marks in each paper/practical shall be reserved for Internal Assessment. The following parameters (with weightage of each) forming the basis of award of Internal Assessment shall be adopted and inserted in the relevant scheme of examination: -
 - (i) One class test : 10 marks
 - (ii) Assignment submission : 05 marks
 - (iii) Attendance : 05 marks

Marks for Attendance will be given as under:

- (1) 91% onwards : 5 Marks
- (2) 81% to 90% : 4 Marks
- (3) 75% to 80% : 3 Marks
- (4) 70% to 74% : 2 Marks*
- (5) 65% to 69% : 1 Mark*

*For students engaged in co-curricular activities of the Colleges only/authenticated medical grounds duly approved by the concerned Principal.

5.2 The marks obtained by a candidate in Internal Assessment, duly countersigned by the Principal of the College/Institute concerned shall be forwarded to the Examinations Branch invariably within 20 days after the commencement of the relevant Semester examination. Thereafter, a late fee, as prescribed by the University from time to time, shall be charged from the College/Institute concerned. The Internal Assessment awards of a candidate who fails in any semester examination shall be carried forward to the next examination

5.3 The Principal of the College/Institute shall preserve the record on the basis of which the Internal Assessment awards have been prepared, for inspection if needed by the University up to six months from the date of declaration of the Semester result.

6 The First/Second/Third/Fourth/Fifth/Sixth/Seventh/Eighth Semester examinations shall be open to a regular student who:

- (a) has passed, not less than one academic year previously, the requisite qualifying

examination as laid down in clause 3, or is covered under clause 4 or 7;

- (b) has remained on the rolls of the College/Institute during one Semester preceding the examination; and
- (c) has his/her Examination form submitted to the Examinations Branch through the Principal of the College/Institute and produces the following certificates:
 - (i) of good character;
 - (ii) of having attended not less than 80% of the full course of lectures delivered in each paper/practicum/tutorial and 90% for Engagement with Field (Working with Community, School Exposure and Multicultural Placement and School Internship) separately in each Semester (the course to be counted up to the day before the commencement of the examination). Provided that a candidate who has not attended the requisite percentage of lectures for any paper(s)/ practical(s) will be detained by the college/institute concerned to take the external examination in the said paper(s)/practical(s) unless he/she repeats the course in that paper(s)/practical and obtains the requisite percentage of attendance therein.

6.1 A deficiency in the prescribed course (Lectures/Practicals/Tutorials/Internship) may be condoned by the Principal of the College/Institute concerned up to 15% on genuine grounds only.

These shall also include loss of attendance due to participation in the cultural and sports assignments etc. Provided that a student who participates in the Inter-University Tournaments/Youth festivals may be allowed additional condonation on this ground upto 10% in each paper on a certificate from the Director, Physical Education and Sports or the Director, Youth and Cultural Affairs Department, as the case may be, subject to the condition that such a student shall not be allowed to appear in the examination if his/her attendance, after condonation on all counts, falls below 50%.

7. A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of instruction in the College/Institute for any semester examination, but does not appear in it, or, having appeared fails, may be allowed on the recommendation of the Principal of the College/Institute concerned, to appear/re-appear in the semester examination/Paper(s), as the case may be, as an ex-student, without attending a fresh course of instruction only twice, at the subsequent examinations.

7.1 A candidate who fails to pass the whole examination (First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and Eighth semesters) within period of six years of his/her admission to the course, shall be deemed to be unfit for the course.

8. A candidate who has appeared and failed or having been eligible did not appear in the I, III, V and VII Semester examination shall be promoted from I to II, III to IV, V to VI and VII to VIII Semester respectively subject to the provision of Clause 8.1.

8.1 A candidate who has failed in Semesters I and II or III and IV or V and VI shall be promoted to the III, V and VII Semester, as the case may be, only if he has got exemption in paper(s) mentioned below:

From I year (Semesters I & II)
to II year (Semester III)

If he has passed at least 50% papers of Semesters I & II. Provided that, promotion to Semester III may be made provisionally till such time the result of Semester II is declared.

From II year (Semesters III & IV) to III year (Semester V)

If he has passed at least 50% papers of Semesters I & II and at least 50% papers of Semesters III & IV. Provided that, promotion to Semester V may be made provisionally till such time the results of Semester IV and Semester II (re-appear, if any) are declared.

From III year (Semester V & VI) to IV year (Semester VII)

If he has passed all the papers of Semesters I, II, III & IV and at least 50% papers of V & VI. Provided that, promotion to Semester VII may be made provisionally till such time the results of Semester VI and Semester IV/II (re-appear, if any) are declared.

9. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each Semester shall be the same as prescribed by the University from time to time.

A candidate, who re-appears in one or more paper(s)/Semester(s) shall pay fee as for the whole semester examination.

10. The medium of instructions shall be English/Hindi or both in case of the B.A.:B.Ed., whereas in case of the B.Sc. B.Ed. the medium of instruction will be English only.

10.1 The medium of examination shall be as under: –

(a) The question-papers shall be set both in English and Hindi except for Science and language subjects in which these will be set as under: –

(i) For Sanskrit

Hindi.

(ii) For Hindi and Panjabi Hindi and Panjabi respectively.

(iii) English and Science subjects English.

(b) The candidates shall write their answers: –

(i) in English in the subject of English and Science subjects;

(ii) in English or Hindi or Panjabi in the case of other subjects.

11.1 The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination in each semester shall be as under:

(i) 50% in each theory paper;

(ii) 50% in each practicum/practical examination and School Internship;

(iii) 50% in aggregate of Sessional and examination for each theory and Practical paper;

11.2 A candidate who fails in an examination shall be exempted from re-appearing in the paper(s)/practical(s) in which he/she has obtained at least 50% marks as indicated in (i), (ii) and (iii) above. Such candidates will not be required to repeat the sessional work.

11.3 The candidates of Science Stream will be given “B.Sc. B.Ed. Degree” and the candidates of Humanities and Social Sciences Streams will be given “B.A. B.Ed. Degree”.

12. As soon as possible, after the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of candidates and the Detailed-Marks-Cards will be issued by the Result Branch.

13. The result of candidates who have passed all the Eight semester examinations, shall be classified into divisions as under on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Semester examinations taken together, and the division obtained by the candidate will be stated in the degree: –

(a) Those who obtain 60 % or more marks First Division.

(b) Those who obtain 50% or more but less than 60% marks Second Division.

(c) Candidates who pass all the eight semester examinations in first attempt and within minimum duration of the course after obtaining 75% or more marks of the total aggregate shall be declared to have passed with ‘Distinction’.

14.1 A person who has already passed B.Sc. B.Ed./B.A.B.Ed. from this University may appear in any additional teaching subject of B.Sc.B.Ed. or B.A.B.Ed. examination, as the case may be,

subsequently except the subjects in which he/she has already passed the examination on submission of the prescribed Examination form and fee as prescribed by the University from time to time.

Provided that: –

- (i) in the case of a Pedagogy subject, she/he must have already passed 10+2 examination in that subject;
- (ii) in addition to the Written Paper of the Pedagogy subject, the candidate shall undergo a practical test in the Pedagogy of the additional subject taken by her/him;
- (iii) Such candidates will be required to register themselves with a B.Ed. College of this University by paying a fee of Rs.1000/- to the concerned College/Institution by 31st October of the respective session.

14.2 The minimum number of marks required to pass in the additional subject shall be as indicated in clause 11.

15. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of this course which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all students whether old or new.

Minutes of the meeting of the Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor consisting of the following to examine the value of ‘Mr. Rajeshwar Lal Scholarship’ in view of less interest earned on the total endowment fund of the Scholarship held on 25.10.2018 at 12:30 p.m. in the O/o the Dean Academic Affairs, KUK.

The Committee was apprised that the donor, Dr.(Mrs.) Usha Gupta, 61/5, Ranijas Road, Karol Bagh, New Delhi-110005 was requested and reminded many times to increase the amount of endowment fund. As per report given by the Postman, she has refused to receive the letter which shows she is not interested to increase the endowment fund. Therefore, the expenditure on account of the Scholarships (@ 375/- p.m. each and the total amount of the Scholarship i.e.@9000/- p.a.) cannot be met out of the less interest earned from Endowment Fund of Rs. 1,20,000/- deposited by the donor.

Considering the above, the Committee recommends that the amount of existing scholarship namely ‘Mr. Rajeshwar Lal Scholarship’ may be decreased from Rs. 375/- p.m. to Rs. 300/-p.m. each i.e, Rs. 600/- p.m. for two scholarship to bear the expenses within the interest of Endowment Fund and award the scholarships with the existing terms & conditions of the Scholarship.

Annexure-I

1. Academic Costume

- a. In these rules academics costume means the costume prescribed in Clause 3 hereunder.

Memorandum of Understanding



The **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING** (MoU) made and entered into on this _____ (dd-mm-yyyy), by and between following parties:

A. **KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, KURUKSHETRA**, which expression shall mean and include its successors in interest and assigns of the second party (hereinafter referred to as KUK)

AND

B. **THE ZOOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA**, which expression shall mean and include its successors in interest and assigns of the first party (hereinafter referred to as ZSI)

Whereas KUK and ZSI are interested in entering into a MOU with a view of sharing a common desire to explore, extend and strengthen the functional relationship between the Universities and National Organizations in order to share the facilities and expertise available with each of them, herewith, sign this MOU on following broad understanding:

1. The ZSI will provide short-term workshops/training/Project training to the faculty/students of KUK in focused areas of ZSI either at Hqts or regional centres on request from the University/concerned faculty/Department of Studies. The number of students to be accommodated in every academic year for dissertation/training/project report works may vary depending on the availability of space and other facilities at ZSI and KUK.
2. Ph.D. students working at KUK will be allowed to carry out a part of their research work at ZSI or associated Institutions, if desired so, and the ZSI will extend all necessary facilities and expertise to the research students. Scientists working in ZSI either at Hqts or regional centres of the level of Scientist-C or above shall be recognized as Ph.D. Co-Supervisor of Ph.D. students of KUK as per KUK norms.
3. Exchange of faculty and/or staff, a visiting fellows either as part of collaborative research activities or for acquiring specific expertise to each other's Organizations shall be facilitated.
4. Project fellows/Research scholars/scientific staff working in different disciplines at ZSI or associated Institutes may register for Ph.D. degree to be awarded by KUK provided the candidates passes the Ph.D. admission test

conducted by the University and completes Ph.D. course work according to KUK ordinance. Admitted scholars can pursue their course work in the laboratory of concerned supervisor of ZSI either at Hqts or regional centres provided that all the examinations of course work will be conducted at KUK as per KUK ordinance.

5. The Scientist/Director working at the ZSI shall be recognized as Ph.D. Supervisor of KUK and ZSI to be recognized as the Research Centre for undertaking Doctoral Work by Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. The thesis supervisor of the ZSI will be of the level of Scientist-C having at least 5 research publications or above provided he/she fulfills the qualifications to become a research supervisor as per KUK norms and also provided that the thesis co-supervisor shall be among the faculties of the concerned department of KUK.
6. The Travel allowances on the visits of Scientists from ZSI for any academic discussions/RDC meeting/Ph.D. viva-voce examination of the student of the Institute will be borne by the ZSI.
7. The scientists of ZSI or its regional centres may take part in teaching programme of KUK worked out by both the Institutions from time to time. Lectures on the scientist's area(s) of specialization(s) for the benefit of students of SOS, be delivered.
Topics of lectures and days/time will be fixed by mutual consultation between the Scientist and Head/Chairperson of concerned Department of KUK. The Travel allowances on the visits of Scientists of ZSI and Faculty of KUK will be borne by the ZSI and the KUK, respectively. However, local hospitality to the invitees will be provided by the one another host institution..
8. The ZSI will extend all technical support and guidance in starting relevant courses/programs at KUK campus, if desired so, without any kind of financial liability.
9. The faculty/Scientists of KUK and ZSI may apply for joint collaborative research projects and patents to National and International funding agencies. Data generated through such collaborative research will be published in peer reviewed journals jointly by the scientists of both the institutions.
10. This MoU is valid for a period of five years from the date of signing of this MoU.
11. If at any time one party is unable or unwilling to continue with the MoU, then the concerned party agrees to notify the other promptly and on completion of 2 months after such notification, this MoU will be terminated.

12. The parties shall endeavor to resolve any dispute, claim or controversy that may arise, out of or in connection with this MoU or the application, implementation, validity, breach or termination thereof through friendly consultations between them. Any dispute, which could not be resolved amicably, shall be settled as per the provisions of Arbitration & Conciliation Act of India, 1996.

13. The agreements shall be subject to laws of India.

14. The terms of cooperation for any other academic activity other than those mentioned in the MoU shall be mutually discussed and agreed upon in future, if the need arise, shall be adopted.

15. This "MoU" is based upon the express Agreement that the information contained herein, or made available in connection with any further investigation is strictly confidential and for the exclusive use of KUK and ZSI. This document shall not be photocopies, reproduced, or distributed to others at any time without the prior written consent of the parties. Provided that, should any party be required to disclose any information subsequent to requirements of laws or regulations applicable to it, it shall be able to disclose such information as required without any prior consent.

16. The following will constitute the Coordination Committee to coordinate and monitor the collaborative programme between the two institutions:
- a. Vice-Chancellor, KUK or his/her nominee
 - b. Director, ZSI or his/her nominee
 - c. Dean, faculty of life sciences or his/her nominee
 - d. Chairperson, Department of Zoology K.U.K. or his/her nominee

The identified area(s) of research along with the project representatives from KU and ZSI respectively are given below:

- i) Wetland ecological study and Agro-biodiversity study
- ii) Ecological studies with reference to High Altitude Fauna including taxonomy, wildlife biology, population and community ecology, monitoring of faunal diversity;
- iii) Studies on the Indian Himalayan Region
- iv) Studies in different Protected areas of India
- v) Research work related to Animal diversity and monitoring
- vi) DNA Bar-coding, population genetics, phylogenetics, DNA forensics of investigated fauna

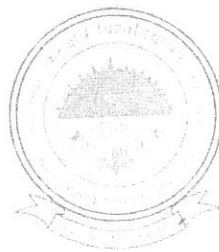

AGREEMENT:

This Memorandum of Understanding (here after referred to as MoU) is made on the on ____ day of _____, between **Advance Tech India Pvt.Ltd** one part and **Department of Electronic Science, Kurukshetra University** on the other part as partners for promoting the industry-academic interaction and to help achieve academic excellence.

Whereas both **Advance Tech** and **Elect. Sc. - Deptt. to increase interaction & would jointly monitor the performance of collaboration between –Elect. Sc. Deptt. and Advance Tech.



Rules and Regulations for Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism
in Kurukshetra University.

Objectives:-

- (i) To create awareness about responsible conduct of research, thesis, dissertation, promotion of academic integrity and prevention of misconduct including plagiarism in academic writing among student, faculty, researcher and staff.
 - (ii) To establish mechanism through education and training to facilitate responsible conduct of research, thesis, dissertation, promotion of academic integrity and deterrence from plagiarism.
 - (iii) To develop systems to detect plagiarism and to set up mechanisms to prevent plagiarism and punish a student, faculty, researcher or staff of University committing the act of plagiarism.
1. Every student submitting a thesis, dissertation, or any other such documents (excluding assignments, project reports, course work, term papers, answer scripts etc.) to the University shall submit an undertaking indicating that the document has been prepared by him or her and that the document is his/her original work and free of any plagiarism (Annexure-1).
 2. The documents including thesis and dissertation shall be duly checked through a plagiarism detection tool approved by the University.
 3. The Plagiarism Detection Software – URKUND will be used for the thesis/dissertation submitted in a language other than English.
 4. Each supervisor shall submit a certificate indicating that the work done by the researcher under him/her is plagiarism free (Annexure-1).
 5. The soft copies of all dissertations and thesis shall be submitted to INFLIBNET within a month after the award of degrees for hosting in the digital repository under the "Shodh Ganga e-repository".
 6. There shall be University Repository on University website to include thesis/dissertation etc.
 7. The similarity checks for plagiarism shall exclude the following:
 - (a) All quoted/referred work with all necessary permission, if required.
 - (b) All references, bibliography, table of content, preface and acknowledgements.
 - (c) All generic terms, laws, standard symbols, and standard equations.
 - (d) Common knowledge or coincidental terms, up to fourteen (14) consecutive words.
 - (e) Research papers published by the student from his/her thesis/dissertation.

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8. Departmental Academic Integrity Panel (DAIP):

- (a) All Departments/Institutes in the University shall notify a DAIP whose composition shall be as given below:

- (i) Chairman - Chairman/Director of the Department/Institute.
- (ii) Member - Senior academician from outside the department, to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.
- (iii) Member - A person well versed with anti-plagiarism tools, to be nominated by the Chairman/Director the Department/Institute.

The tenure of the members in respect of points (ii) and (iii) above shall be two years.

The quorum for the meetings shall be 2 out of 3 members (including Chairman).

- (b) The DAIP shall follow the principles of natural justice while deciding about the allegation of plagiarism against the student, faculty, researcher and staff.
- (c) The DAIP shall have the power to assess the level of plagiarism and recommend penalty(ies) accordingly.
- (d) The DAIP after investigation shall submit its report with the recommendation on penalties to be imposed to the UAIP within a period of 45 days from the date of receipt of complaint/ initiation of the proceedings.




9. University Academic Integrity Panel (UAIP):

- (a) There will be a UAIP whose composition shall be as given below:

- (i) Chairman – Dean, Academic Affairs/Senior academician of the University.
- (ii) Member - Senior Academician other than Chairman, to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor
- (iii) Member - One member nominated by the Vice-Chancellor from outside the University
- (iv) Member - A person well versed with anti-plagiarism tools, to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor.

The Chairman of DAIP and UAIP shall not be the same. The tenure of the Committee members including Chairman shall be three years. The quorum for the meetings shall be 3 out of 4 members (including Chairman).

- (b) The UAIP shall consider the recommendations of DAIP.

- (c) The UAIP shall also investigate cases of plagiarism as per the provisions mentioned in these regulations.
- (d) The UAIP shall follow the principles of natural justice while deciding about the allegation of plagiarism against the student, faculty, researcher and staff of University.
- (e) The UAIP shall have the power to review the recommendations of DAIP including penalties with due justification.
- (f) The UAIP shall send the report after investigation and the recommendation on penalties to be imposed to the Vice-Chancellor within a period of 45 days from the date of receipt of recommendation of DAIP/ complaint / initiation of the proceedings.
- (g) The UAIP shall provide a copy of the report to the person(s) against whom inquiry report is submitted.

10. Detection/Reporting/Handling of Plagiarism


If any member of the academic community suspects with appropriate proof that a case of plagiarism has happened in any document, he or she shall report it to the DAIP. Upon receipt of such a complaint or allegation the DAIP shall investigate the matter and submit its recommendations to the UAIP of the University.

The University authorities can also take *suomotu* notice of an act of plagiarism and initiate proceedings under these regulations. Similarly, proceedings can also be initiated by the University on the basis of findings of an examiner. All such cases will be investigated by the UAIP.

11. Levels of Plagiarism and Penalties

Penalties in the cases of plagiarism shall be imposed on students pursuing studies at the level of Masters and Research programs and on researcher, faculty & staff of the University only after academic misconduct on the part of the individual has been established without doubt, when all avenues of appeal have been exhausted and individual in question has been provided enough opportunity to defend himself or herself in a fair or transparent manner.

University Academic Integrity Panel (UAIP) shall impose penalty considering the severity of the Plagiarism.

11.1: Penalties in case of plagiarism in submission of thesis and dissertations





Level of Plagiarism	Similarities	Penalties
0	Upto 10%	No Penalty
1	Above 10% to 40%	Student shall be asked to submit a revised script within stipulated time period not exceeding 6 months.*
2	Above 40% to 60%	Student shall be debarred from submitting a revised script for a period of one year.*
3	Above 60%	Student registration for that programme/topic shall be cancelled.
Repeated Plagiarism		Student shall be punished for the plagiarism of one level higher than the previous level committed by him/her. In case where plagiarism of highest level is committed then the punishment for the same shall be operative.

*Subject to the time period mentioned in the ordinance of Ph.D./Master degree

- Note: (i) If plagiarism or any other form of malpractice is proved on a date later than the date of award of degree or credit as the case may be then the Academic Council of Kurukshetra University on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor shall have the right to withdraw the candidate's degree or credit awarded to him/her.
- (ii) If plagiarism is proved for a thesis/dissertation work submitted in a language not recognized by the recommended software/tool, then appropriate penalty will be recommended by UAIP (or an expert committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor) and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.

11.2 Penalties in case of plagiarism in academic and research publications

Level of Plagiarism	Similarities	Penalties
0	Upto 10%	No Penalty
1	Above 10% to 40%	Shall be asked to withdraw manuscript.
2	Above 40% to 60%	(i) Shall be asked to withdraw manuscript. (ii) Shall be denied a right to one annual increment. (iii) Shall not be allowed to be a supervisor to any new Master's, M.Phil., Ph.D. Student/scholar for a period of two years.
3	Above 60%	(i) Shall be asked to withdraw manuscript. (ii) Shall be denied a right to two successive annual increments. (iii) Shall not be allowed to be a supervisor to any new Master's, M.Phil., Ph.D. Student/scholar for a period of three years.
Repeated Plagiarism		Shall be asked to withdraw manuscript and shall be punished for the plagiarism of one level higher than the previous level committed by him/her. In case where plagiarism of highest level is committed then the punishment for the same shall be operative. In case level 3 offence is repeated then the disciplinary action including suspension/termination as per service rules shall be taken by the University.

Note: (i) If plagiarism is proved on a date later than the date of benefit or credit obtained as the case may be then his/her benefit or credit shall be withdrawn or put in abeyance for a period recommended by UAIP and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.

(ii) If plagiarism is proved for academic and research publications submitted in a language not recognized by the recommended software/tool, then appropriate penalty will be recommended by UAIP (or an expert committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor) and approved by the Vice-Chancellor.

12. If there is any complaint of plagiarism against the Chairman/Director of Department/Institute or authorities at the University level, suitable action, in line with these regulations, shall be recommended by the UAIP and approved by the Competent Authority.
13. If there is any complaint of plagiarism against any member of DAIP or UAIP, then such member shall excuse himself/herself from the meeting(s) where his/her case is being discussed/investigated.
14. The Librarian will conduct the workshops/training programs for all the stakeholders including students, research scholars, staff etc. of the University for using plagiarism detection tools and creating awareness about plagiarism.
15. Elements of responsible conduct of research and publication ethics shall be included in the Ph.D. course work.
16. Elements of responsible conduct of research and publication ethics shall be included in the Orientation and Refresher courses organized for faculty and staff members.
17. These rules and regulations will be applicable to the Ph.D. thesis submitting w.e.f. April 1, 2019 onwards and to P.G dissertations for the students taking admission in first year in the session 2019-20 onwards.
18. The use of URKUND (for the thesis/dissertation submitted in a language other than English) will be applicable to the Ph.D. thesis submitting w.e.f. October 01, 2020 onwards and to the PG dissertations for the students taking admission in first year in the session 2020-21 onwards. Therefore the format given in Annexure-II will be applicable for the thesis submitted upto September 30, 2020. After that format given in Annexure -I will be applicable to such thesis/dissertation also.
19. Procedure for doing similarity checks for plagiarism :
 - (a) The Ph.D. supervisor of the student will forward the soft copy (CD/Pen Drive) of the thesis along with list of exclusions to the University Library for doing similarity checks for plagiarism. The supervisor may do similarity checks for plagiarism at department before forwarding the thesis to the University library. A copy of the report generated by the anti-plagiarism detection tool duly signed by

the librarian will be appended to the thesis along with a certificate (signed by the research scholar and his/her supervisor) as per Annexure-III mentioning exclusions made during the similarity checks for plagiarism. The Supervisor is advised, in his/her own interest, to be present during the similarity checks for plagiarism in the library.

- (b) After doing similarity checks for plagiarism, the librarian will send back the Ph.D. thesis along with the signed report to the supervisor within seven days of the receipt of the soft copy of the thesis. It is responsibility of the research scholar and his/her supervisor to forward the Ph.D. thesis to the University Library in advance keeping in view the time period mentioned in the Ph.D. ordinance.
- (c) The provision of appending report signed by the Librarian along with the certificate (signed by the research scholar and his/her supervisor) mentioning exclusions will be applicable for the Ph.D. thesis submitting w.e.f. Oct. 01, 2019 onwards except for the thesis submitted in a language other than English for which the date of implementation will be October 01, 2020 onwards.
- (d) The Chairperson/Director of the department/institute shall forward the thesis to the concerned branch after verifying the signed report and the signed certificate.


