That we applied for the same and appeared in the entrance test after passing a long and rigorous process we were allowed admission to Ph. D. 4. That a major part of the programme in formalization of the admission like six months Ph.D. Course work, the result of which n.D. Registration Section has already been declared on 26th April, 2018. Presentation has also been completed. Receipt No. That recently a circular has been issued by the University (copy attached) wherein it has been mentioned that in Deans meeting it has been resolved that the Ph.D. Degree in the concerned subject only may be considered. That on the one hand a notification has been issued earlier inviting application for admission to allied subject now on the other hand another notification has been issued mentioning therein that only concerned (main) subject Ph. 

- 2. Further, I am happy to inform that on the lines of CSIR-UGC/ICMR NET, the Ministry of AYUSH through its Research Councils have initiated a National Level Entrance Test namely AYUSH-NET to promote quality research in AYUSH streams. Through this test fellowships are awarded to AYUSH scholars possessing post-graduate qualification (MD/MS) in the field of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani, Homoeopathy and Yoga & Naturopathy (or BNYS degree with 5 years experience) and willing to pursue Ph.D. programme from any Univers y of their own choice. AYUSH-NET consisted of two sections, viz., Aptitude section to test General Science and Research Aptitude; and subject specific section set by the experts in the system. The cut-off marks for the test have also been maintained at a high level in view that the qualifying candidates of AYUSH-NET have come out through an extensive test.
- 3. UGC has now communicated the approval of the Chairman, UGC vide D.O. Letter No. F-21-2/2016(PS/PMO/PG) dated 12.04.2018 addressed to the Secretary AYUSH (copy enclosed for reference) regarding exemption to the AYUSH-NET qualified candidates from taking University Entrance Test for enrolment in Ph.D. programme. UGC has recommended that AYUSH-NET and UGC-NET may be mutually recognized for the purpose of admission to M.Phil/Ph.D. programmes in the subjects covered under AYUSH except for those subjects in which UGC is conducting NET such as 'Yoga'.
- 4. In view of the above-mentioned mutual recognition of UGC-NET and AYUSH-NET for admission in Ph.D. programme, I request you to extend exemption to AYUSH-NET qualified candidates from university entrance test for Ph.D. Programme in your esteemed university and affiliated colleges, similar to the exemption already granted to UGC-NET and CSIR-NET etc. qualified candidates from the Ph.D. Entrance Test. It is also hereby intimated that many of the Universities including Central Universities like BHU, AMU and Jamia Milia etc are already considering exemption to the AYUSH-NET qualified fellows and have also made amendments in their Ph.D. Ordinance and Notification etc.

Subject: - Regarding Exemption from Entrance Test for admission to Ph.D. Course (Pharmaceutical Sciences) for GPAT qualified candidates

This is in reference to Exemption from entrance test for admission to Ph.D. program in Pharmaceutical Sciences of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra. It is kindly submitted that before 2016, GPAT/GATE qualified candidate in Pharmaceutical Sciences were exempted from Ph.D. entrance test of Kurukshetra University. But thereafter, this clause of exemption of GPAT qualified candidates from Ph.D. entrance has been withdrawn. It is requested to review the matter because it is a genuine case and it is a matter of career of several Pharmacy students who want to pursue Ph.D. Course in Pharmaceutical Sciences. Presently, several neighboring Universities are already giving exemption to GPAT qualified candidates from Ph.D. entrance.

It is also pertinent to mentioned here that Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences is running under Self Financing Scheme. Around 25 seats in Ph.D. are lying vacant. If, seats are filled with GPAT qualified candidates under exemption category, there may be an increase in revenue of the Institute. (Fee for Ph.D. Course in Pharmaceutical Sciences is Rs. 80,000/- per annum).



- b. Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with KUK and ICAR-CSSRI will be made available to the faculty and research scholars.

Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- e. Both parties understand that all financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- f. The student, major supervisor and the co-supervisor shall share the authorship of publication arising out of this research work. The authorship for the publication shall depend on the extent of contribution by the authors, by the mutual consent of both the parties.
- g. A soft and hard copy of the thesis/dissertation will also be submitted to the ICAR-CSSRI after award of the degree by the KUK.

Students allotted research work at ICAR-CSSRI will pay fee as per norms set by ICAR-CSSRI and ICAR New Delhi.

6.2 Allotment of the students at the ICAR-CSSRI, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the parties or indulgein such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of either of the parties, or cause damage to the property, will be liable to disciplinary action as per rules of the parties. Accordingly, list of professional courses being run in the University Teaching Departments/Institutes, affiliated Colleges and by Distance Education was prepared and the same was approved by the Academic Council vide Res. No. 31 of 05.08.2011 and Executive Council vide Res. No. 6 of 28.03.2012 (Annexure-II).


