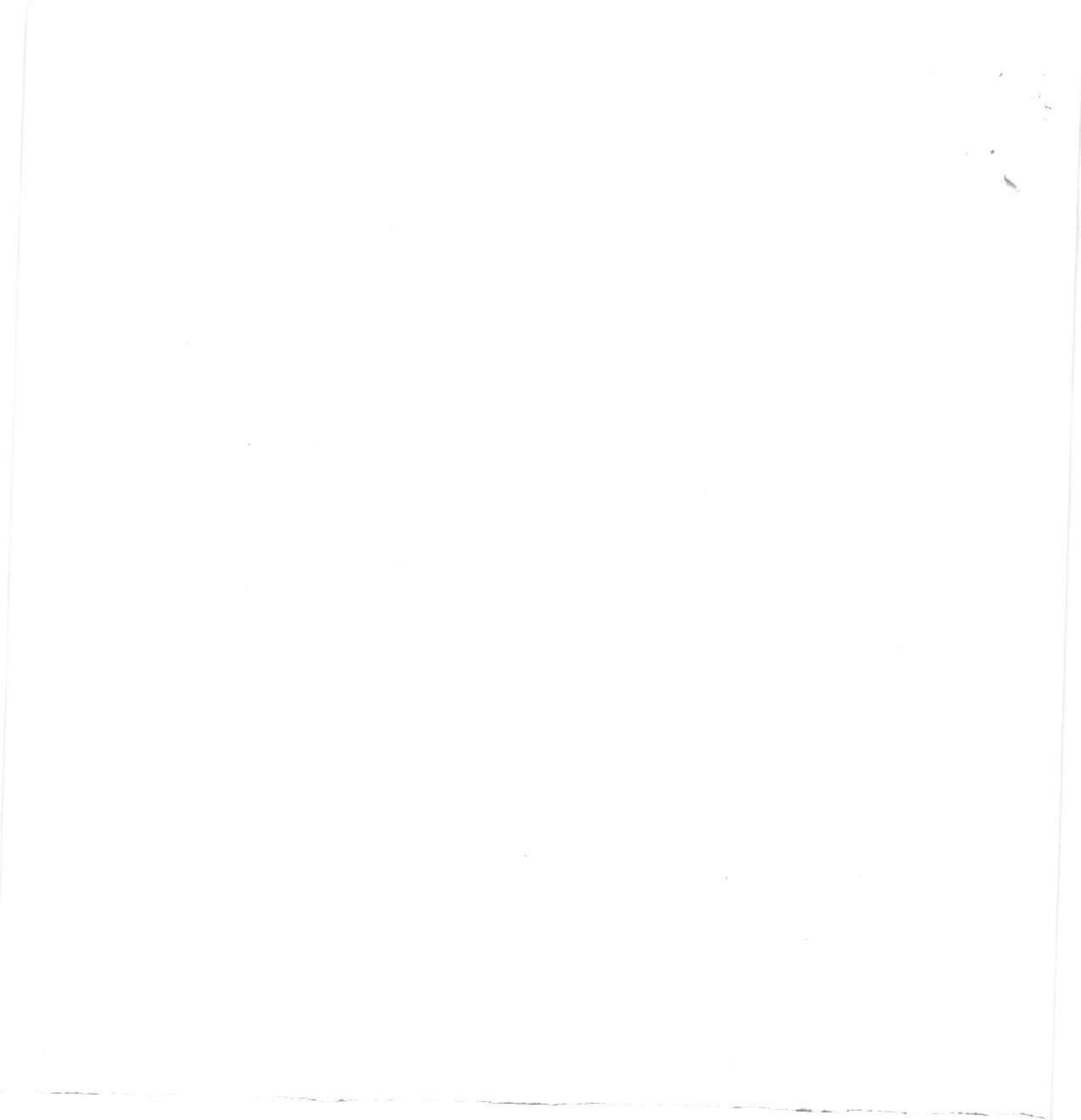

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, KURUKSHETRA
AND

ICAR-INDIAN INSTITUTE OF WHEAT AND BARLEY RESEARCH, KARNAL

The MOU is made on the ----- day of ----- month in the year of 2020, at Kurukshetra, Haryana, between Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra (hereinafter called KUK) include his/her successor in office, legal representative, nominee and assignee as the **First Party**

AND

Indian Council of Agricultural Research –Indian Institute of Wheat &Barley Research, Karnal (hereinafter called ICAR-IIWBR) with its headquarters at Karnal include his/her successor in office, legal representative, nominee and assignee as the **Second Party**.

WHEREAS

The parties which wish to establish a friendly relationship to promote and accelerate the programmes of academic cooperation in the areas of mutual concern, have decided to enter into this MoU and agree hereby as per the articles given below:

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1 DEFINITIONS

- (a) "University" means Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, Haryana.
- (b) "KUK" means Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra
- (c) "ICAR-IIWBR" means Indian Council of Agricultural Research – Indian Institute of Wheat &Barley Research

1.2 RELATION BETWEEN THE PARTIES AND SCOPE

- a. The KUK will recognize the IIWBR as an Institute for research for students of M.Sc. and Ph.D in the disciplines of Biotechnology and allied Biological Sciences. The KUK will recognize scientists of the ICAR- IIWBR as recommended by its Director as faculty for research guidance of M.Sc/Ph.D students. The major supervisor/advisor shall be from KUK and scientists of ICAR- IIWBR as recommended by Director, ICAR- IIWBR can work as co-supervisor/co-major advisor in the advisory committee of the student.

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- b. Research instrumentation facility and library facilities available with KUK and ICAR- IIWBR will be made available to the faculty and research scholars.
- c. There shall be an exchange of students and faculty/scientist staff for research and academic purposes. Accommodation in the Hostel shall be arranged, wherever possible, as per extant rates.
- d. It is understood that the KUK and the ICAR- IIWBR subscribe to the principle of equal opportunity and do not discriminate on the basis of race, sex, age, caste or religion. Both the Institutions shall abide by these principles in the administration of this agreement and neither party shall impose criteria for exchange of scholars or students, which violate principles of non-discrimination.
- e. Both parties understand that the financial agreements will have to be negotiated separately and will depend on the availability of funds.
- f. The student, major supervisor and the co-supervisor shall share the authorship of publication arising out of this research work. The authorship for the publication shall depend on the extent of contribution by the authors, by the mutual consent of both the parties.
- g. A soft and hard copy of the thesis/dissertation will also be submitted to the ICAR- IIWBR after award of the degree by the KUK.

1.3 GOVERNING LAW & JURISDICTION

This MoU, its meaning and interpretation, and the relation between the parties shall be governed by the law applicable in India and they only shall have exclusive jurisdiction over matters relating to or arising from this MoU

1.4 LANGUAGE

This MoU has been executed in English language, which shall be the binding and controlling language for all matters relating to the meaning of interpretation of this MoU


1.5 LOCATION

Research implementation arising under this MoU shall be performed by the second party from the head offices at Karnal and/or its nearest regional office, in addition to Department of Biotechnology, Kurukshetra University as agreed upon by the first party.

1.6 AUTHORISED REPRESENTATIVES

Any section required or permitted to be taken and any document required or permitted to be executed under this MoU may be taken or executed

- a) On behalf of the first party, by the Registrar, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra or his/her designated representative.
- b) On behalf of the second party, by the Director, ICAR- IIWBR, Karnal or his/her designated representative.



2. COMMENCEMENT, COMPLETION, MODIFICATION AND TERMINATION OF THIS MoU

- 2.1 This MoU shall come into force from the date of signing, or other earlier date that is mutually agreed by the two parties.
- 2.2 The MoU shall be effective for a period of five years, but will be reviewed/renewed/modified (if needed) mutually by both the parties, based on the research outputs/outcomes.
- 2.3 This MoU may be modified/amended by mutual written agreement at any time by either party upon written notification signed by the competent authority of the party.
- 2.4 The modification/changes shall become part of the MoU and shall be effective from date on which they are made/executed, unless otherwise agreed to.
- 2.5 The MoU may be terminated prematurely by either party with mutual agreement by giving prior notice. Such notification must be given to the other party at least six months in advance from the effective date of termination.
- 2.6 All joint activities not completed at the expiration or termination of the MoU may be continued until their completion under the terms of this MoU.
- 2.7 After signing by the parties this MoU shall supersede and replace all prior MoU's between the parties.

3. MANAGEMENT

- 3.1 The Registrar, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and Director of ICAR-IIWBR will be responsible to work out operational details of co-operation between the two organizations and ensure proper and effective implementation of this MoU.
- 3.2 The supervisors/advisory committee will meet at least once in a year in KUK or ICAR- IIWBR to review the progress.

4. RESEARCH COLLABORATION

KUK and ICAR- IIWBR will work on mutually agreed collaborative research projects funded by one or both parties and/or by a third party in areas of mutual interest. Each research collaboration will require the approval of competent authorities of both the parties.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

- 5.1 The KUK and ICAR- IIWBR will be expected to ensure protection of the Intellectual Property Rights generated or likely to be generated during the students research work. The KUK and the IIWBR shall be the joint applicants for IPRs and the students and involved scientific staff shall be included as the inventor/breeder/author.



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5.2 Each party will ensure appropriate protection of Intellectual property rights generated from cooperation pursuant to this MoU. Intellectual property rights, research publications and benefits arising out of collaborative research under these agreements shall be jointly sought/owned/shared by KUK and ICAR- IIWBR on case to case basis.

5.3 In case of evaluation of already developed technology/product, IPR shall rest with the providing party of the particular product/technology. The parties shall not assign any rights and obligations arising out of the IPR generated to inventions/activities carried out under the MoU to any third party without the consent of the other party.

6. ADMISSION AND FEES

6.1 All those students who wish to register for Master/Doctoral programmes under this MoU must apply for admission at the KUK. Students admitted under this MoU may do their course work as per prescribed curriculum of KUK at KUK and research at ICAR- IIWBR /KUK. Students allotted research work at ICAR- IIWBR will pay fees as per norms set by ICAR- IIWBR and ICAR New Delhi.

6.2 Allotment of students at the ICAR- IIWBR, if found violating the rules and regulations laid down by the parties or indulge in such activities that amount to tarnishing the image of either of the parties. The KUK will not complete the formalities of issuing the certificates to such students until they compensate the losses to the First party.

7. REPORTING OBLIGATION

The **Second Party** shall submit to the **First Party** reports and documents as may be specified and at such frequency as may be agreed upon between the two parties. The **Second Party** will collect and maintain the records of the students and shall monitor and report their progress to the **First Party**.


8. ARBITRATION

The parties would act strictly according to the relevant provisions of law while implementing this MoU. All questions related to this MoU arising during its term will be settled by the parties by mutual agreement. In case of any dispute that may crop up during execution of MoU the matter would be settled through arbitration by referring it to a committee appointed by the parties on mutual consent.

9. CONSEQUENCE OF BREACH AND PENALTIES

9.1 It shall be obligatory on part of either party to ensure timely Research implementation and facilitation as per the pre-approved work plan as agreed upon in the MoU.

9.2 In the event of breach of any term or conditions of this agreement, either party shall have the right to terminate the agreement and recover the costs incurred that are associated with the project.



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This MoU has been executed in two originals, one of which has been retained by the **First Party** and the other by the **Second Party**.

ORDINANCE MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (M.P.Ed.) EXAMINATION
(Under Choice Based Credit System)
(w.e.f. the session 2019-20)

1.1 The duration of the course leading to the award of Master of Physical Education (M.P.Ed.) Degree shall be two academic years, comprising of four semesters. Each academic year shall be divided into two semesters i.e. Semester-I/III (July to December) and Semester – II/IV (January to May/June).

1.2 Main as well as Supplementary examinations for the First and Third Semesters shall be held in December/January and for the Second and Fourth Semesters in May/June.

1.3 The dates of examination fixed shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations to all concerned courses/departments.

2. The last date(s) by which Examination forms and fees must reach the Examination Enquiry shall be as per schedule in K.U. Cal. Vol. II (Part B)

3. A person who has passed one of the following examinations from this University or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto shall be eligible to join First semester of the course:

(i) Educational Qualification: B.Sc. (Physical Education, Health Education & Sports) with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

OR

Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.Ed.) with at least 50% marks in aggregate.

(ii) Physical Efficiency Test: All the eligible candidates will be required to qualify the Physical Efficiency Test (PET). However, the criteria and the specifications of the individual events of the Canadian Test will be decided by the Department of Physical Education, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra.

Note: Married female selected candidates will have to submit a certificate from RMO/MO of the University Health Centre that she is not in family way, along with an undertaking that if during the course of study, it is found that she is in family way, her admission would be liable to be cancelled IPSO-FACTO and all dues paid by her shall be forfeited.

4. A person who has passed M.P.Ed. First and Second Semester Examinations of this University, shall be eligible to join Third Semester Class of M.P.Ed. Course. This is, however, subject to the provisions made under Clause 9 below.

5. Every candidate shall be examined according to the scheme of examination and syllabus as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. A candidate, who fails in an examination, or having been eligible fails to appear in an examination, shall unless approved otherwise by the Academic Council, take the examination according to the syllabus prescribed by the University for regular students appearing for that examination.

5.1 Each course will have a certain number of credits which will reflect its weightage. A student's performance/progress will be measured by the number of credits that he/she has completed satisfactorily. (The detailed Rules/Guidelines for Implementation of Choice Based Credit System of Study and Award of Grades are at Appendix-II in K.U. Cal. Vol.II).

5.2 All evaluation of different components of course shall be done in marks for each student. The marks of various components shall be reduced to approved weightage, as indicated in the scheme of examination and added to get total marks secured on a 100 point scale. The rounding off shall be done on the higher side. A minimum Grade Point Average will be required to be maintained for

satisfactory progress. Also a minimum number of earned credits shall have to be acquired in order to qualify for the degree as specified in the relevant Scheme of Examination.

5.3 Credits of a course will be evaluated as under:-

- (a) For all theory courses, one lecture hour per week (Semester-wise) will be assigned one credit.
- (b) Two laboratory/Practical/Field Work hours per week (Semester-wise) will be assigned one credit. Course with odd numbers of laboratory/Practical/Field Work hours having fractional credits will be accepted. The courses having 1.5 hours Teaching schedule as per scheme of the course per week of 3 hours Teaching schedule alternate week will be rationalized to have integer number of contact hours per week so that fraction smaller than 0.5 are not involved in credit assignments of laboratory courses/Practical/Field Work.

6. The grade awarded to a student in each course will be based on performance of the student in Minor Tests comprising of Class tests; Seminar; Attendance etc and End-Term Examination at the end of each Semester. The distribution of the weightage will be as per Scheme of Examination.

6.1 The courses of the study and the subjects of examination shall be as approved by the Academic Council from time to time. The examination shall consist of:-

- (a) Written Papers;
- (b) Practical Examination;

6.2 Internal Assessment of 20% marks in each theory paper shall be reserved. The following parameters (with weightage of each) forming the basis of award of Internal Assessment shall be adopted and inserted in the relevant scheme of examination: -

For Theory Papers:

- (i) One test/Seminar : 50% marks for each paper (10 marks)
- (ii) One Class test : 25% marks (one period duration) (5 marks)
- (iii) Attendance : 25% marks (5 marks)

Marks for Attendance will be given as under:

- (i) 91% onwards : 5 Marks
- (ii) 81% to 90% : 4 Marks
- (iii) 75% to 80% : 3 Marks
- (iv) 70% to 74% : 2 Marks*
- (v) 65% to 69% : 1 Mark*

* For students engaged in co-curricular activities of the Departments/colleges only/authenticated medical grounds duly approved by the concerned Chairperson/Principal.

6.3 The marks obtained by a candidate in Internal Assessment, duly countersigned by the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College concerned shall be forwarded to the Examinations Branch invariably within 20 days after the completion of the relevant Semester examination. Thereafter, a late fee, as prescribed by the University from time to time, shall be charged from the Department/College/Institute concerned.

6.4 The Chairperson/ Director/Principal of the Department/Institute/College concerned shall preserve the record on the basis of which the Internal Assessment awards have been prepared, for inspection, if needed by the University up to six months from the date of declaration of the concerned semester result.

7.1 The First/Second/Third/Fourth Semester Examinations shall be open to a candidate who:
 (a) has passed the requisite qualifying examination as laid down in Clause 3, if he/she is a candidate for the First Semester Examination or is covered under Clause 4 or 9

(b) has his/her examination form submitted to the Examinations Branch through the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College concerned and produces the following certificates:

(i) of good character

(ii) of having attended not less than 75% of the full course of lectures delivered in each paper, tutorials etc. in each semester separately (the course to be counted up to the day before the commencement of the examination). Provided that a candidate who has not attended the requisite percentage of lectures for any paper(s) will be detained by the Department/College concerned to take the external examination in the said paper(s) unless he/she repeats the course in the paper(s) concerned and obtains the requisite percentage of lectures in that paper(s).

7.2 A deficiency in the prescribed course (Lectures/Tutorials) may be condoned by the Chairperson of the University Department/Principal of the College concerned as under:

(a) Lectures Up to 15% of lectures delivered in each paper.

(b) Practicals Up to 5% of total in each paper.

(c) Tutorials Up to 15% of total conducted.

These shall also include loss of attendance due to participation in the cultural and sports assignments etc. Provided that a student who participates in the Inter-university Tournaments/Youth Festivals may be allowed additional condonation on this ground up to 10% in each paper on production of a certificate from the Director, Physical Education and Sports or the Director, Youth and Cultural Affairs Department, as the case may be, subject to the condition that such a student shall not be allowed to appear in the examination if his/her attendance, after condonation on all counts, falls below 50%.

8. A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of instruction in the Department/College for any semester examination, but does not appear in it, or, having appeared fails, may be allowed on the recommendation of the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the college, to appear/re-appear in the semester examination/paper(s), as the case may be, as an ex-student, without attending a fresh course of instruction only twice, at the subsequent examinations.

9.1 A candidate who has appeared and failed in one or more paper(s) of the First Semester shall be allowed to study for and appear in the Second Semester. He/she shall, however, be allowed promotion to the Third Semester provisionally only if he/she earns exemption in at least 50% of theory papers of both the first and second semester examinations taken together. Such a candidate will be allowed to re-appear for the paper(s) of the First Semester, along with the Third Semester and for the remaining paper(s) of the Second Semester along with the Fourth Semester examinations simultaneously, when held.

9.2 A candidate who fails to pass in any semester examination even in the second chance as mentioned above, he/she will have to repeat the course as a regular student in the Department/College whenever the relevant course(s) is/are offered in the future.

9.3 A candidate who fails to pass all the four semester examinations within four years of his/her admission to M.P.Ed. Course shall be deemed to be unfit for this programme. The bar shall not apply to a candidate appearing to avail the extra chance in the Fourth Semester examination, provided the extra chance is availed next to the last admissible normal chance under Clause 8 above.

10. The amount of examination fee to be paid by a candidate for each Semester shall be as prescribed by the University from time to time. A candidate, who re-appears in one or more paper(s)/Semester(s) for the purpose of passing/improvement of division/result, shall pay fee as for the whole examination.

11. The medium of instruction for M.P.Ed. course shall be English/Hindi.

The medium of examination shall be as under:

(a) The question-paper shall be set both in Hindi and English.

(b) The candidates shall write their answers in English or Hindi only.

12. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination in each semester shall be as under:

(i) 40% in each paper (Written and Practical separately), i.e. letter Grade 'P'

(ii) 40% in Dissertation;

(iii) 40% in the aggregate of internal assessment and Major Test (End Semester Examination) for each written paper i.e. letter Grade 'P' in each course.

(iv) 40% in aggregate of each Semester viz., I/II/III/IV.

While re-appearing in the examination the candidate shall be exempted from appearing in Paper(s) and/or Practical(s) in which he/she has obtained atleast Grade 'P'(40% marks).

13.1 A candidate opting for Dissertation as an optional subject in M.P.Ed. IVth semester, shall submit his/her Synopsis and get the topic of Dissertation approved from the Departmental Research Advisory Committee (DRAC).

13.2 The candidate offering dissertation must submit his/her dissertation not less than one week before the commencement of the IVth Semester Examination. However, after expiry of above date the extension in the date shall be permissible with penalty as laid down in the General Rules for Examinations.

If a candidate fails to submit the Dissertation even during the extended period, he will be considered to have absented in the Dissertation paper and his/her result shall be declared accordingly.

13.3 The dissertation is evaluated by the External Examiner.

13.4 The marks obtained by him/her for the Dissertation shall be taken into account when he/she appear in any future examination for the purpose of passing therein or for improving the performance/result.

14. Award of Grade and the corresponding Grade Points should be based on Absolute marks as under. The conversion factor for conversion from SGPA/CGPA to percentage of marks shall be 10. The combined marks obtained by a student in various components of evaluation of a course shall be converted into a regular letter grades with their equivalent grade point as specified below:

O (Outstanding)	10	85-100
A+ (Excellent)	9	75-84
A (Very Good)	8	65-74
B+ (Good)	7	55-64
B (Above Average)	6	50-54
C (Average)	5	41-49
P (Pass)	4	40

Ab	0	Absent

Note: (1) A candidate eligible to take the examination obtaining Grade F or Ab will be considered to have failed in the examination/paper(s). Such a candidate will be required to re-appear

in that examination/paper(s) within the permissible chances given in the concerned ordinance for obtaining pass grade.

- (2) A candidate who has not attended requisite percentage of lectures in a course and/or obtained pass marks in Internal Assessment, where prescribed will also be awarded Grade 'F'. Such a candidate will have to repeat that course(s) to complete the attendance requirement and obtain pass mark in Internal Assessment.
- (3) If 'F'/Ab' Grade is awarded to a candidate in major project, he/she will get only one more chance to repeat the project work at the end of next Semester. However, if a candidate still gets 'F'/Ab' Grade in major project, the same will not be eligible for the award of degree.
- (4) For Non Credit course 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.

15. As soon after the termination of the examination, as possible the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the candidates and the Detailed-Marks-Cards will be issued by the Results Branch.

16. The list of successful candidates of Fourth Semester examination shall be arranged, as under, on the basis of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) obtained in the overall in the Four Semesters i.e. First, Second, Third and Fourth Semester examinations taken together, and the CGPA obtained by the candidate will be stated in the Degree (along with the name of the Department).

17.1 A person who has passed the Master of Physical Education (M.P.Ed.) Examination of this University and is desirous of improving his/her performance, will be allowed to appear as an ex-student in the M.P.Ed. Examination thrice in one or more theory paper(s) of all the four semester examinations within a period of five years of his/her passing the M.P.Ed. Examination. Such a candidate, in the first instance, shall be required to intimate all the paper(s) in which he/she would like to improve his/her performance. He/she will then appear in the respective paper(s) of the semester examination, simultaneously in December/May. If he/she does not improve his/her performance, he/she shall be eligible to do so in the following year(s) which would be treated as second chance. In case the candidate does not improve his/her performance even in the second chance, he/she will be given third chance to improve his/her performance.

17.2 The result of such a candidate shall be declared only if he/she improves his/her performance in the aggregate of all the four semesters examinations by taking into account the marks obtained by him/her in the paper(s) in which he/she re-appeared and the marks obtained by him/her earlier in the remaining paper(s) etc., whichever are higher. The fact that the candidate has improved the performance shall be mentioned in the DMC.

Provided that the candidate will take the examination according to the Syllabus in force for the regular students in that Semester Examination in which he/she proposes to take the examination for the purpose of improving his/her performance.

18. Notwithstanding the integrated nature of this course which is spread over more than one academic year, the Ordinance in force at the time a student joins the course, shall hold good only for the examination held during or at the end of the academic year and nothing in this Ordinance shall be deemed to debar the University from amending the Ordinance and the amended Ordinance, if any, shall apply to all the students whether old or new.

Minutes of the meeting of the Committee, constituted by the Vice-Chancellor held on 26.06.2020 at 11.00 a.m. in the office of the Dean Academic Affairs with regard to finalize the draft guidelines for awarding of grades and implementation of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) in the various Under-graduate Courses being run in the Institute of Integrated & Honors Studies (IIHS) and in other Departments/Institutes in the Campus w.e.f. the Session 2020-21 for preparing the Ordinances of various Under-graduate Courses :-

At the outset, the Committee was informed that as decided in the earlier meeting of the Deans' Committee held on 26.05.2020, the draft Guidelines with regard to implementation of the Choice Based Credit System and Awards of Grades in under-graduate courses as supplied by the Principal, IIHS have been circulated to all concerned for offering their comments in the next meeting. Accordingly, the Committee discussed the matter at length and also gone through the scheme of the examinations for the various Under-graduate course being run in the IIHS in the campus for implementing CBCS w.e.f. the session 2020-21. The Committee also discussed the UGC norms and Guidelines of the State Govt. of Haryana for awarding credits to the programme & courses and unanimously observed that in order to maintain a uniformity, the number of credits for an under-graduate courses programme should exits between 140-146 credits.

After detailed deliberations, the Committee unanimously recommends that

- (i) the Rules/ Guidelines with regard to implementation/Award of the Credit Based System and Scheme of Examinations for assigning Credits in a paper(s) in the various Under-graduate Courses as per Annexure-I are finalized by the all Deans of the Faculties.
- (ii) Annexure-I may be sent to all Deans of the Faculties to circulate in respective department(s) for preparing syllabi accordingly and get approved from their respective bodies.
- (iii) Approved guidelines (Annexure-I) may be sent to all Deans of the Faculties to get prepare/supply the draft Ordinance of U.G. Courses (under CBCS) of their concerned department/institute through Chairpersons/Dean of their Faculty as per revised guidelines.

REGULATIONS/GUIDELINES FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) OF STUDY AND AWARD OF GRADES IN VARIOUS UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS (BASED ON UGC GUIDELINES)

(w.e.f. the Session 2020-21)

1. The University has introduced Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) of Study in all the Under-graduate course being governed by UGC Rules and running at the University Campus, w.e.f. the session 2020-21 in phase manner.

2. **Definitions of Key Words:**

Academic Year: Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.

Semester: Each semester will consist of 15-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to December and even semester from January to June.

Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS): The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective or minor or soft skill courses).

Credit Based Semester System (CBSS): Under the CBSS, the requirement for awarding a degree or diploma or certificate is prescribed in terms of number of credits to be completed by the students.

Duration of the Programme: The programme shall be extended over a period of three years comprising of six semesters with two semesters in one academic year. Each semester shall consist of a minimum of **450 contact hours distributed** over 90 working days spread over 15-16 weeks of six days duration each and 4-5 contact hours per day. The Semesters from July to December are Semesters I, III and V (called Odd Semesters) and from January to June are Semesters II, IV and VI (called Even Semesters).

Programme: An educational programme leading to the award of a degree, diploma or certificate.

Credit: A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week. One credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching (lecture or tutorial) or two hours of practical work/field work per week.

Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.

Grade Point: It is a numerical weight allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.

Letter Grade: It is an index of the performance of students in a said course. Grades are denoted by letters O, A+, A, B+, B, C, P and F.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA): It is a measure of performance of work done in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.

Transcript or Grade Card or Certificate: Based on the grades earned, a grade certificate shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester. The grade certificate will display the course details (code, title, number of credits, grade secured) along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.

Course: Usually referred to, as 'papers' is a component of a programme. All courses need not carry the same weight. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/tutorials/laboratory work/field work/outreach activities/project work/Vocational training/viva/seminars/term papers/ assignments/ presentations/self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.

Core Course: A course compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course. The course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline

Elective Course: Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course: Elective course offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

Dissertation/Project: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and the candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.

Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.

A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives be referred to as Generic Elective.

Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses are of two kinds:

Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. These are mandatory for all disciplines.

* Environmental Studies

* English/MIL Communication Functional Hindi

* **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

Introducing Research Component in Under-Graduate Courses

Project work/Dissertation is considered as a special course involving application of knowledge in solving / analyzing/ exploring a real life situation / difficult problem. A Project/Dissertation work would be of 6 credits. A Project/Dissertation work may be given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.

3. Every course will be coordinated by a member of the regular teaching staff of the Department/Institute, called as Course Co-ordinator, duly approved by the Staff Council of the Department/Institute. He/she shall have the full responsibility for conducting the course. If a course is shared among more than one faculty, the senior most faculty will be Course Co-ordinator. He/she will coordinate the work of the other members of the faculty involved in that course holding the tests and assignments, and awarding the grades. For any difficulty, the student is expected to approach the Course Co-ordinator for advice and clarification. In addition, one faculty member of the Institute/Department shall act as Faculty Advisor for the students for this purpose. No contractual faculty/ Adhoc faculty/Teaching associate will act as course Co-ordinator for setting of question

paper and evaluation of major test. For a course which is taught by contractual faculty/Adhoc Faculty Teaching associate a regular faculty will be assigned as course Co-ordinator by Departmental Evaluation Review Committee (DERC) which will comprise of Chairperson/Director and two senior most teachers of the Department/Institute.

4. **Examination, Assessment and Evaluation: -**

Each course has a certain number of credits which reflect its weightage. Credits of a course will be evaluated as under: -

- (a) For all lecture courses, one credit will be one hour teaching/tutorial per week (Semester-wise) generally.
- (b) Two laboratory hours per week (Semester-wise) will be assigned one credit. Course with odd numbers of laboratory hours having fractional credits will be accepted. The courses having 1.5 hour Teaching schedule as per scheme of the course per week of 3 hours Teaching schedule alternate week will be rationalized to have integer number of contact hours per week so that fraction smaller than 0.5 are not involved in credit assignments of laboratory courses.

4.1 The ratio of major and minor tests evaluation will be in the range of 80:20 to 60:40 as decided by the Board of Studies in the subject concerned keeping in view norms of respective regulatory bodies i.e. UGC, AICTE, NCTE, PCI, BCI etc. The grade awarded to a student in each course will be based on performance of the student in Minor Tests (best two out of three), co-curricular activities (assignments, attendance, viva-voce, lab. work, seminar, workshop, presentation, group discussions, quiz etc.) and Major Test at the end of each Semester. Unless otherwise provided, the distribution of the weightage will be as under OR as approved by the concerned Board of Studies and inserted in the relevant scheme of examination:-

Internal Assessment	20%

(Modalities/guidelines for awarding Internal Assessment Marks shall be the same as already prescribed by the Executive Council from time to time and inserted in the relevant scheme of examination.)

All tests i.e. Minor Tests as well as Major Tests (End Term Examination) will be conducted in the University Department/ Institute. The question papers for Major Tests (End Term Examinations) except Open Elective Paper will be got set, printed and evaluated by Controller of Examinations as per the recommendations of Board of Studies of Institute/Department. The press copy of the paper after setting up of question paper by the paper setter appointed through BOS will be sent to the Examination Branch for printing. 50% of the papers will be set internally & 50% externally as recommended by BOS while all the evaluation will be made internally.

The Minor Tests after the evaluation will be shown to the students by respective teachers. In case the student is not satisfied with the evaluation of Major Test, he/she may apply for re-evaluation.

4.2 The Chairperson/Director/Principal of the Department/Institute shall forward the soft as well as hard copies of the final awards of the internal assessment based on minor test (best two out of three) and co-curricular activities (assignments, attendance, viva-voce, lab. work, seminar, workshop, presentation, group discussions, quiz etc.) of the students to the Examination Branch.

4.3 The Examination Branch will prepare and declare the grade/ result and will notify.

4.4 End Term examination (Major test) shall be open to a regular student who:

- (i) has been on the rolls of the Institute/Department during the Semester.
- (ii) has attended not less than 75% of the lectures in each paper, seminar, case discussion, field trips, tutorials, etc. This requirement shall be fulfilled separately for each course of study. A deficiency in the prescribed course (Lectures/Practicals) may be condoned by the Chairperson/Director/Principal of the Department/Institute in a very hard and deserving case upto 10%.

4.5 Unless otherwise provided in the Ordinance for relevant examination, the minimum Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and CGPA (Cumulative Grade Point Average) required for the continuation of registration and the award of degree is 4.00.

5. Award of grades and the corresponding grade points should be based on Absolute marks as under. The conversion factor for conversion from SGPA/CGPA to percentage of marks shall be 10.

- Note:
- (1) A candidate eligible to take the examination obtaining Grade F or Ab will be considered to have failed in the examination/paper(s). Such a candidate will be required to re-appear in the examination/paper(s) within the permissible chances given in the concerned Ordinance for obtaining pass grade.
 - (2) A candidate who has not obtained pass marks in Internal Assessment, will also be awarded Grade 'F'. Such a candidate will have to appear for Minor test and obtain pass marks in Internal Assessment.
 - (3) If 'F'/'Ab' Grade is awarded to a candidate in major project, he/she will get only one chance to repeat the project work at the end of next Semester. However, if a candidate still obtains 'F'/'Ab' Grade in major project, the same will not be eligible for the award of degree.
 - (4) For non credit courses 'Satisfactory' or 'Unsatisfactory' shall be indicated instead of the letter grade and this will not be counted for the computation of SGPA/CGPA.

6. Computation of SGPA and CGPA

The following shall be the procedure to compute the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA):

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(i) . The SGPA is the ratio of sum of the product of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits of all the courses undergone by a student, i.e

$$\text{SGPA} (S_i) = \Sigma(C_i \times G_i) / \Sigma C_i$$

Where C_i is the number of credits of the i th course and G_i is the grade point scored by the student in the i th course.

(ii). The CGPA is also calculated in the same manner taking into account all the courses undergone by a student over all the semesters of a programme i.e.

$$\text{CGPA} = \Sigma(C_i \times S_i) / \Sigma C_i$$

where S_i is the SGPA of the i th semester and C_i is the total number of credits in that semester.

(iii) The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to 2 decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

- (2) While assigning the letter grade corresponding to the marks obtained, the fraction of 0.5 above marks shall be rounded up to the nearest higher integer and below 0.5 shall be ignored.
- (3) Transcript (Format): Based on the above recommendations on Letter grades, grade points and SGPA and CGPA, the examination branch of the University may issue transcript for each semester and a consolidated transcript indicating the performance in semesters after completion of the programme.

7. General Guidelines for Award of Grades

The following are the general guidelines for the award of grades:

- (i) All evaluations of different components of course shall be done in marks for each student.
- (ii) The marks of various components shall be reduced to approved weightage (as decided by the S Council) and/or indicated in the scheme of teaching and examination and added to get total marks secured on a 100-point scale. The rounding off shall be done on the higher side.
- (iii) The merit list will be prepared and Gold Medal will be awarded in the examinations under CBCS the candidates securing highest CGPA provided the candidate must have passed all the Semester Examinations at the first attempt and within minimum duration of the course. In case two candidates obtain the same CGPA then both the candidates will be awarded Gold Medal.

8. Award of Grace Marks:

A candidate who fails in one or more paper(s)/subject(s) (Major test/Written, Practical, Sessional/Minor test/Internal Assessment or Viva-Voce) and/or in CGPA shall be given Grace Marks up to 1% of the aggregate marks (aggregate marks excluding the marks for Minor test/Internal Assessment/Sessional(s) of Paper(s)/subject(s) in which s/he has actually appeared in that examination, if by addition of these marks s/he can pass the examination.

The Grace Marks shall be first added to the paper(s)/subject(s); the remaining Grace marks, to the extent still necessary, shall then be added to the aggregate and the same number of marks shall be added to the subject wherever required."

The grace marks will also be allowed, if otherwise eligible, in case the student's CGPA in the last semester of the course improves from less than 5.00 to 5.00 or more.

However, if a candidate, after ascertaining from the Transcript/University that s/he has been given Grace Marks, represents, against the Grace Marks awarded to her/him the same shall be withdrawn; her/his result will be revised. The option once exercised shall be final. The request of the candidate for withdrawal of Grace Marks must reach the Controller of Examinations within one month of the dispatch of Transcript by the University, after which no request will be entertained.

1. **An Undergraduate programme degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences** will be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice (from a list of subject combinations notified by the university and offered in the institute), 4 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers (offered in the institute).
2. **An undergraduate degree with Honors in a discipline** will be awarded if a student completes 14 core papers in that discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective and 6 Generic Elective papers respectively.
3. **An undergraduate degree in vocational discipline** will be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in that discipline, 4 core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on that discipline and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers (offered in the institute).
4. **An undergraduate Programme degree in Science disciplines** will be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in three disciplines of choice (from a list of subject combinations notified by the university and offered in the institute), 3 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.
5. **An undergraduate Programme degree in Home Science disciplines** will be awarded if a student completes 12 core papers in the discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 6 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the discipline.
6. **An Undergraduate programme degree in Commerce (general)** will be awarded if a student completes 16 core papers in the discipline, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 4 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the discipline and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers (offered in the institute).
7. **An Undergraduate programme degree in Computer Applications** will be awarded if a student completes 12 core papers in the discipline, 3 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) and 6 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the discipline.
8. **An Undergraduate programme degree in Tourism Management** will be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers in English, 8 core papers in the discipline, 3 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 3 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the discipline.

9. An Undergraduate programme degree in **B.A. Mass Communications** will be awarded if a student completes 16 core papers in the discipline, 3 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Course (SEC), 04 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers (DSE) based on the discipline and 02 papers from the list of the Generic Elective (GE) papers.
10. An Undergraduate programme degree in **B.Sc. Programme in Multimedia/Graphics & Animation/Printing & Packaging Technology** will be awarded if a student completes 16 core papers in the discipline, 3 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 06 papers from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers (DSE).
11. An Undergraduate programme degree in other courses running in the departments/institutes will be awarded as per scheme of the examination of the course.
12. The credit(s) for each theory paper/practical/tutorial/project/dissertation will be as per the scheme of the examination.
13. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism will be adopted:
 - i) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration
 - ii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hour duration
14. Institute(s) may evolve a system/policy about Extra Curricular Activities/General Interest and Hobby Courses/Sports/NCC/NSS/related courses on its own.
15. Institute(s) may evolve a system/policy about Extra Curricular Activities/General Interest and Hobby Courses/Sports/NCC/NSS/related courses on its own.
16. A student can opt for one additional subject in Undergraduate programme degree. However, the option of additional subject/credit hours will commence from the third semester onwards.
 - (i) A candidate who has passed Semester-I & II, examination of the Three-Year Degree Course in any of the Faculties of Arts, Science, or Commerce, under the CBCS, and desires to appear in one or more subject(s)/paper(s) prescribed for Semester-I, II, III & IV examinations as additional subject(s) shall appear in Semester-I, II, III & IV, as the case may be, in the subject(s)/paper(s) concerned provided he/she fulfills the other conditions prescribed under Statutes.
 - (ii) A candidate who has already qualified all the semesters of the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(General) course shall be permitted to appear in additional subject(s) in a Semester/s simultaneously, provided that in the case of subject(s) involving practical examination a candidate must have attended at least minimum number of practical sessions prescribed for the subject(s) in the institute.

*The institute will offer the additional course depending upon the availability and feasibility of the infrastructure and faculty in the concerned subject.


