- 1. **Administrative Procedures:** Routine office circulars are being sent by email. Official email account has been given to all faculty member and officials. The scope of tally ERPG is being expanded to generate 37 MIS output reports.
- 2. **Student admission:** Computerized processing of admission data using spreadsheets is being done. Admission to engineering, computer science and B.ED are made online through centralized counselling. The announcement to admission and merit lists of selected students is displayed on the university website.
- 3. **Student Records:** Comprehensive Student records are compiled at the Department level and the required information is provided to registration and examination branch which have been computerised to a great extent.
- 4. **Evaluation and examination procedures:** To expedite the declaration of results, the transposing of awards to respective DMCs is being automated with the help of OMR file page on answer sheets, introduced in engineering, management, and some of the on-campus courses. The preparation of results is being outsourced and the printing of duplicate DMCs and degrees has been computerized.

- 5. **Research administration:** Office of Dean, Research & Development oversees research activities in the University and acts as a link between the researchers and the University. Based on the feedback received from the researchers, Dean, Research & Development proposes the policies and procedures to facilitate the research activities on the campus.
- 6. **Others:** A monthly report of various activities and achievements of the departments is sent to the Chancellor of the University. Further, the activities and achievements of all the academic and administrative units of the University for a calendar year are documented in the form of a comprehensive Annual Report of the University.
