

"the Parties"

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP focuses on achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goal 4.7 towards education for building peaceful and sustainable societies across the world by developing programmes that promote social-emotional learning, innovate digital pedagogies and empower youth. UNESCO MGIEP is seeking to mobilize partners for the achievement of its strategic goals and programme priorities;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP, through its Rethinking Youth Programme is building the capacities of youth especially through universities to deliver and receive high quality social-emotional learning (SEL) leveraging the power of online experiential learning on the UNESCO MGIEP FramerSpace online learning platform;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP in partnership with Life University (USA) has developed the *Self-directed Emotional Learning for Empathy and Kindness (SEEK)* online self-directed course based on the *Compassionate Integrity Training (CIT)* course developed by Life University and hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP GDPR-compliant Framers Space Learning Platform.

Whereas, the Partner, Kurukshetra University was established in 1956, recognized by the UGC, is NAAC accredited 'A+' university and is focused on preparing a class of proficient scholars and professionals with ingrained human values and commitment to expand the frontiers of knowledge for the advancement of society and be globally acknowledged as a distinguished centre of academic excellence. The Kurukshetra University Centre for Training Internship and Employment (KUCTIE) will be the Nodal Centre to carry forward this partnership agreement

Whereas, the Partner Kurukshetra University would like to provide the Faculty and students skills in social and emotional intelligence and resilience, interpersonal skills, and holistic systems-level thinking.

Now therefore, the Parties hereby agree as follows
Article 1 – Objectives

By the present Agreement, UNESCO MGIEP and the Partner agree, through joint and concerted cooperation:

- 1.1 For the Partner(KUK) to sign **up to 1000 Faculty, Staff, Students as a first trial cohort** to enrol and obtain completion certification in the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK online course by April 2022;
- 1.2 For UNESCO MGIEP to deploy a Partner branded instance of the SEEK course providing

free-of-cost access for the agreed first cohort of learners;

- 1.3 To provide professional thematic and technical support for all enrolled learners;
- 1.4 To promote the deployment of SEEK through the Partner's key national and international events
- 1.5 Following the review of the first cohort, the Partner may agree to commit additional Staff and student learners through 2 cohorts of up to 2000 students on voluntarily basis, each annually for a mutually agreed fee of Rs 500 per learner for additional specialised services by UNESCO MGIEP.

Article 2 – Obligations of the Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra (Party-1)

- 2.1 The Partner agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
- 2.2 The Partner may enroll up to 1,000 Faculty Staff and university students for the first trial cohort to enroll and obtain completion certification in SEEK by April 2022;
- 2.3 The Partner agrees to nominate up to 2-10 Faculty/Staff to undertake further advanced Facilitator Training in order to provide thematic and technical support to future learners from their university;
- 2.4 The Partner agrees to extensively promote the association with UNESCO MGIEP and the deployment of the SEEK course at key national and international events and relevant stakeholders;
- 2.5 The Partner may consider including SEEK as an open elective course for building ethical values and 21st century skills for its students and provide a University certification of completion towards acquiring these credits.
- 2.6 Only after the successful completion and review of the trial cohort, the Partner may commit to the commercial deployment of SEEK at scale through the offer of an open elective course offered annually to 2 cohorts of up to 2000 learners on voluntarily basis each for INR 500 per learner.

Article 3 – Obligations of UNESCO MGIEP (Party -2)

- 3.1 UNESCO MGIEP agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
- 3.2 UNESCO MGIEP will implement a Partner-branded instance of the SEEK course on the UNESCO FramerSpace platform.
- 3.3 UNESCO MGIEP will provide learner support through the online Global SEEK Learner Community public access Masterclasses;

5.3 Status of the Partner

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing a legal partnership (such as, by way of clarification, partnership liability), joint venture, agency, exclusive arrangement or other similar relationship. Neither the Partner nor anyone whom it may employ shall be considered as an agent of UNESCO MGIEP or a member of the staff of UNESCO MGIEP and, except as otherwise provided herein, shall not be entitled to any privileges, immunities, compensation or reimbursements, nor shall be authorized to commit UNESCO MGIEP to any expenditure or other obligations.

5.4 Conformity with Laws

The Partner agrees to respect the laws of the country it is operating in and guarantees that it will not permit any official of UNESCO MGIEP to receive a direct or indirect profit from this Agreement. Furthermore, The Partner certifies and warrants that it has not, nor have its members, been convicted of any crimes and that there are currently no lawsuits or legal actions being taken against it. Should this happen, The Partner undertakes to notify UNESCO MGIEP immediately.

5.5 Privileges and Immunities of UNESCO MGIEP

Nothing in or relating to the present Agreement shall be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of UNESCO MGIEP. The Partner shall hold harmless, defend and indemnify UNESCO MGIEP against all lawsuits, claims, costs and liabilities resulting from any intellectual property disputes or other disputes occurring under the present Agreement and which arise out of acts or omissions of The Partner.

5.6 Assignment

None of the Parties shall assign, transfer, pledge or make other disposition of the present Agreement or any part thereof or of any of their rights, claims or obligations under the present Agreement except with the prior written approval of the other Parties. Any of the aforementioned actions taken without such written approval shall not be valid.

5.7 Settlements of Disputes

All disputes arising out of or in connection with the present Agreement shall be settled by mutual understanding. However, if no amicable settlement can be arrived at, any dispute shall be arbitrated according to the rules defined by UNCITRAL (United Nations Commission on International Trade Law).

3.4 MGIEP will provide the following additional specialized services:

- a. Setup of the Partner Learner Community with dedicated learner support staff;
- b. Special Masterclass sessions for the Partner learners;
- c. UNESCO MGIEP will provide advanced training opportunities for up to 2-10 selected Faculty Staff to acquire Facilitator-level certification in SEEK;
- d. UNESCO MGIEP will extensively promote the association with relevant stakeholders and invite the Partner to key national and international events.
- e. Joint Social media promotions for SEEK outreach with the Partner

3.5 UNESCO MGIEP will provide full technical support for the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK course hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP FramerSpace digital learning platform including email support during Indian business hours and an escalation system of MGIEP personnel and set number of hours or days for the resolution of system issues;

Article 4 – Media activities

- 4.1 The projects, their conception, their implementation, their development, their impact and their outcome will necessitate informational and promotional activities at the initiative of - and on the part of- the parties, separately or jointly.
- 4.2 Each party is authorized to use the name, the logo and any element of the other's identity, through the use of citations, references to, reproductions, representations on the occasion of the promotion of projects, of public relations, operations, of interviews, of relations with the media (press files, articles, releases etc.) throughout the world. This use, which must adhere to the image of the concerned party, must receive the prior and written consent by UNESCO MGIEP or KUK when it relates to information activities external to the Partner.
- 4.3 The media and information support (films, photographic pictures, etc.), as well as all the rights related to them, will belong exclusively to the Party who makes and finances them. They can only be used by the other Party after the latter obtains the prior consent of the proprietary party. Notwithstanding that, the proprietary party can refuse to authorize their use if the rights given up (copyright, trademark) do not cover the foreseen exploitations.

Article 5 – General Conditions

5.1 Use of the Name, Emblem or Official Seal of UNESCO MGIEP

Unless authorized in writing by parties shall not use the name, acronym or official logo of each other, or any abbreviation for advertising or any other purposes.

5.2 Status of UNESCO

Supporting the objectives of UNESCO and of the United Nations Organization, the Partner will respect the status of UNESCO as an intergovernmental organization of the United Nations system with its own distinct Constitution. The Partner confirms that it is not directly

5.8 Termination

- 5.8.1 Should either Party fail to meet its obligations, the other Party may terminate the present Agreement upon 3 (three) months' written notice to the other Party. The same will apply with respect to incidents making the realization of the Project extremely hazardous. In particular, the Partner may withdraw from the Project and cease all financial contributions if the funds it has contributed have not been directly available to the Project.
- 5.8.2 Upon the termination of the present Agreement, the Partner shall not use UNESCO MGIEP's name, emblem or official seal, or any abbreviation of the name of UNESCO MGIEP, for promoting the Project or any other purposes.
- 5.8.3 Upon the termination of the present Agreement, the Partner shall inform all relevant, past, actual or potential partners (including all persons or bodies that have been informed by the Partner of UNESCO MGIEP's participation in the Project(s)), that UNESCO (i) has terminated its Agreement with The Partner, (ii) is no longer participating in the Project(s).

5.9 Amendment

This Agreement, including this provision, may not be waived, modified or changed in any manner except by a written amendment signed by each of the parties hereto.

5.10 Non-Exclusivity

It is understood that this Agreement does not confer the Partner any exclusivity regarding activities such as those covered by this Agreement, and the Partner accepts that UNESCO MGIEP is currently collaborating on similar activities worldwide with other partners.

Article 6 – Notification

Article 7 – Duration



The "ICSI" and the "Kurukshetra University" are hereinafter, collectively referred to as the 'PARTIES' and individually as a 'PARTY'.

WHEREAS:

- I. THE INSTITUTE OF COMPANY SECRETARIES OF INDIA (ICSI) is the only recognized professional body in India to develop and regulate the profession of Company Secretaries in India.
- II. Kurukshetra University, established by the State Legislature Act XII of 1956, in a premier institution of higher learning in the country is accredited at by NAAC and ranks eight among in State Universities.
- III. The Parties have appreciated each other's objectives in promoting Excellence inter alia in common area of interest, imparting knowledge and skills required to operate in the area of Academic, Research and Training and are desirous of putting the broad terms of the intentions into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the areas identified for co-operation and commit to co-operate to the fullest extent by mutual understanding.
- IV. Kurukshetra University missions to prepare a class of proficient scholars and professionals with ingrained human values and commitment to expand the frontiers of knowledge for the advancement of society.
- V. This MoU is subject to the approval of the respective Statutory Authorities of the parties hereto and subject to changes as may be desired.
- VI. The implementation and/or conduct of a programmes, courses or activities as specified in this MOU shall be negotiated and determined mutually by the parties vide separate additional agreement or document to be signed by both parties.

- VIII. The development and implementation of specific forms of cooperation based on this MoU will be separately established/ decided between parties and outlined in executive protocols, specifying the nature of joint activities, financial and other arrangements.


NOW THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSES AS FOLLOWS:

- IX. Both the Parties have hereto identified the following areas where they agree to mutually cooperate to the fullest extent:
- Kurukshetra University will accord its necessary recognition to Company Secretary Qualification as equivalent to Post Graduate Degree for the purpose of admission to Ph.D. in Management/ Commerce and allied Programmes at Kurukshetra University, subject to their equivalency by Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi and Statutory bodies, as inforce from time to time.
 - ICSI on its part would facilitate the conduct of Specialised Training Programmes in Kurukshetra University for the Faculty Members, Research Scholars and Students of Kurukshetra University on areas of mutual interest by providing experts on its rolls.
 - Kurukshetra University on its part may nominate ICSI Members for Academic Council or other bodies of Schools / University as it deem appropriate.
 - Kurukshetra University on its part would share the expertise of its Faculty Members as mutually desirable by way of acting as resource persons for Training Programs or workshops organised by ICSI.
 - Jointly organise Workshops, Seminars, Continuing Education and Training programmes and similar Academic Programmes for Practicing Professionals, Corporate Executives & Faculty Members, Research Scholars and students of Kurukshetra University on themes of Topical and Professional interest on equal surplus/deficit sharing basis.
 - Regular exchange of journals published by the parties hereto on a complimentary basis with liberty to reproduce in each other's publications, such portion or portions, which may be of interest, subject to acknowledging the source
 - Exchange of Faculty Members as may be mutually agreed subject to convenience of the parties hereto

- h. Regularly exchange course materials, case studies, research publications and other academic and research inputs.
- i. Undertake joint research projects which are mutually beneficial.
- j. Reciprocate participation in National and International conferences organised by the parties hereto.
- k. Extend help and Co-operation in developing Curriculum of Academic and Continuing Education Programmes, on such terms as may be mutually agreed to including Joint Meeting of Curriculum Development Committees/bodies.
- l. Organise programmes jointly for Training of Trainers (ToT) for mutual benefit and advantage.
- m. ICSI and Kurukshetra University would work jointly for Teacher Congruence by organising specialised programmes together.
- n. Exemptions in University subjects for the students of ICSI in topics such as Corporate Governance if deem appropriate by Kurukshetra University.
- o. The ICSI may assist Kurukshetra University in devising up a Governance Code for University or other Systems/Practices as asked by Kurukshetra University from time to time.
- p. ICSI at its discretion may co-opt Kurukshetra University Registrar/ Nominee on Managing Committee of ICSI as deem appropriate by Kurukshetra University.
- q. Any other matter of mutual interest including sharing of facilities like infrastructure, library, reading room etc., as may be mutually agreed.

X. ICSI Signature Award

The ICSI may award the Signature Awards to the toppers of Kurukshetra University. Under this Scheme, Top Rank Holder in the B.Com. Examinations or topper of selected programmes/ papers of Kurukshetra University shall be awarded a Gold Medal and Merit Certificate. Top three rank holders in the aforesaid examinations shall also be eligible for waiver of Registration Fee while registering for the CS Course in Executive Programme.

XIII. ICSI Library Scheme for Universities and Institutions.

The ICSI is the premier body in Corporate Governance and research. It has got more than 200 own publications in various areas of corporate Governance, Company laws and Capital market. The ICSI may provide its own publications and also selected books of other publishing house free of cost to the Kurukshetra University for use of the students and members, to be kept in the library of Kurukshetra University as a knowledge sharing platform.

XIV. Participation in ICSI National and International Seminars and Workshops :




XVI. ICSI Counsellors:

XVII. Non Binding Nature of the MoU


Nothing in this MoU shall be construed as creating any contract, partnership, agency or other legal relationship between the parties. The acts/performance and actions taken by either party in furtherance of their respective activities of operation shall not bind the other except to the extent provided under this MoU. The acts performed and action taken by either party that do not fall under the MoU shall have binding effect on the other to the extent they are reduced to writing and the prior consent of the other party is obtained. Also, the MoU does not restrain or preclude parties from entering into similar MoUs with any other organization during currency or the extended currency of this MoU.

That it is expressly understood & agreed between the parties to this MoU that the personnel(s) employed or hired or engaged (permanent/ regular/ casual/ contractual/ temporarily/ daily wage or whatever be the status/name) by the Kurukshetra University directly or indirectly for the performance of the obligations under this MoU, shall not be employee of the ICSI for any purpose and none of such person of Kurukshetra University shall have any right to claim anything against the ICSI and same shall be applicable vice versa to ICSI.

XVIII. Terms and Termination of the MOU


The MoU shall come into force immediately upon its signing by the parties. The MoU will be in force for an initial period of five (5) years. MoU may be extended further on the mutually agreed terms. Kurukshetra University shall not have any right to claim extension or renewal of contract.

- a) This MoU may be terminated by mutual consent of the parties before the aforesaid term of five (5) years.
- b) This MoU can also be terminated by either of the parties by giving advance notice of three (3) months period without jeopardizing the ongoing collaborative undertakings.
- c) The implementation and/or continuance of programmes or project established pursuant to this MoU prior to the effective date of termination shall not be affected by the termination of this MoU.

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XIX. Indemnification:

Each Party shall, at its own expense, defend, indemnify, and hold the other Party harmless for damages, liabilities, claims, losses, costs, demands, suits, actions, and reasonable expenses (including but not limited to reasonable attorneys' fees and settlement costs) (collectively, "Damages") arising out of or related to any third party suits or claims brought against the indemnified Party (i) arising out of or related to the indemnifying Party's violation of any applicable laws, gross negligence, or willful misconduct, or (ii) arising out of or related to any physical damage to property, or personal injury or death, caused by the indemnifying Party or any of its Affiliates, participants, officers, directors, and employees.

The indemnifying party shall be granted immediate and complete control of any claim of indemnity and the indemnified party shall not prejudice the indemnifying party's defence of the claim.

The indemnified party shall give the indemnifying party all reasonable assistance at the expense of the indemnifying party on such claim of indemnity.

XX. Intellectual Property Right



XX. Force Majeure

"Force Majeure Event" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of the Parties concerned, including, without limitation, unavailability of any communication system, sabotage, fire, flood, explosion, acts of God, civil commotion, strikes or industrial action of any kind, riots, insurrection, war or acts of government.

In any arbitration commenced pursuant to this clause, the sole arbitrator shall be appointed by the mutual consent of the parties as per the provisions of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996. The seat, or legal place, of arbitration shall be New Delhi, India. The cost of the Arbitration proceedings shall be shared equally by both the parties.

XXXII. Jurisdiction

All disputes arising out of or relating to the MoU shall be deemed to have arisen in New, India and only courts having jurisdiction over New Delhi, India shall determine the same.

XXXII. Notwithstanding the above, the scope of this MOU shall automatically become null and void to the extent it is in violation or in contradiction to the provisions of the concerned Rules and Guidelines of the ICSI.





This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is made at Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on 10th day of-September- Two Thousand Twenty One (10/9/2021), is entered into by and

BETWEEN

Institute of Mass Communication and Media Technology, Kurukshetra University, Thanesar, Haryana - 136119, having its registered office at Thanesar, Haryana - 136119 (hereinafter referred to as the "University", which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or the meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns).

AND

NEWSHOUND INDIA FOUNDATION, a Section 8 company incorporated and registered under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013, having its registered office at 106, The Castle, Sector 56, Gurugram, Haryana, represented through its director, Mr. Arjun Samar Mahendran (hereinafter referred to as "Newshound", which expression shall, unless repugnant to the context or the meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns)

For the purposes of this MOU, Newshound and the University shall collectively be referred to as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party".

WHEREAS:

- (i) Newshound is India's only non-profit media network, facilitating student journalists through means of round-the-year, training, paid and remote internships which include on- ground reporting and engaging with local sources to bring relevant, grassroots issues to the forefront.
- (ii) The University has represented to Newshound that it is a reputed institute which has developed and established a centre to provide media studies-related education, and facilities related thereto, to various students from across India.
- (iii) Based on the representations made by each of the Parties to the other Party, and having regard to the expertise of either Party in the relevant fields of journalism and education, the Parties have entered into this MOU to record the terms and conditions of the understanding in respect of Newshound extending various opportunities to the University's students, and the University providing access to Newshound to their media lab.

NOW THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITNESSETH and it is hereby agreed and declared between the Parties as follows:

1. Each Party represents and warrants to the other Party that:

- 1.1 it has the power and authority to execute and deliver this MOU, and carry out its obligations and exercise its rights hereunder, and the consummation of this understanding does not derogate or conflict with its bye-laws or memorandum of association or any other contract or understanding it has with any other person;
- 1.2 the execution and delivery of this MOU and the promises, agreements or undertakings under this MOU do not violate any (i) law, rule, regulation or order applicable to it; or (ii) agreement or any other instrument which it has executed with any other person(s); or (iii) its bye-laws or memorandum of association or such other document of a similar nature;
- 1.3 the information and details (both oral and written) provided by it for the purposes of this MOU and the understanding contemplated hereunder are true and correct and not misleading in any manner whatsoever.

2. By executing this MOU, the Parties hereby agree and acknowledge that the Parties shall make best efforts to do and complete a number of the following:

- 2.1 provide opportunities to all media students enrolled in the University through a process satisfactory to the University ("Student Journalists");
- 2.2 promote student journalism by means of extending paid, round-the-year, remote internships to the Student Journalists;
- 2.3 provide on-ground news reporting and news feature production experience to Student Journalists;
- 2.4 connect Student Journalists and journalism faculties across India;
- 2.5 assist Student Journalists in creating a relevant portfolio;
- 2.6 aim to create the largest network of on-ground student reporters in India;
- 2.7 aim to extend, or facilitate the extension of, INR 300 (Indian Rupees five hundred) for every original segment uploaded on any of Newshound's platforms or in relation to any story chosen and being worked on by a Student Journalist (the mode and terms whereof shall be mutually discussed and decided between Newshound and the relevant Student Journalist);
- 2.8 assist Student Journalists network with veteran journalists from the journalism profession, along with other relevant industry professionals;
- 2.9 network with prospective donors to assist student journalism and further the objects of the charter documents of Newshound;



- 2.10 bringing together contributors, collaborators and mentors to join and provide facilities and services to mentor Student Journalists
3. The areas of cooperation may include, subject to mutual consent between the Parties, any other desirable and feasible activities that would further the common goal of providing facilitating the first wave of student journalists in India, including but not limited to, rendering further requisite financial, infrastructural and educational assistance and support to the Student Journalists.
 4. The Parties anticipate that a number of the activities and initiatives listed above shall occur during the term and tenure of this MOU. However, provided neither Party commits or omits to do any actions in derogation of the terms of this MOU, neither Party is or shall be deemed to be obligated to agree to the completion of any minimum number of activities or initiatives set out above.
 5. The Parties hereby agree and acknowledge that, in order to achieve the objectives and complete the actions set out in this MOU, and in addition to the activities and initiatives set out above in Clause 2 of this MOU, the Parties shall, with mutual written consent, appoint not more than 2 (two) persons (unless otherwise agreed between the Parties), each of them being students of the University, each of whom shall individually be referred to as a "Newshound Student Facilitator". It is further agreed that such Newshound Student Facilitator shall act as the point of contact between Newshound, the Student Journalists and any other students enrolled in the University. Such Newshound Student Facilitator shall also, at regular intervals, update Newshound of the progress of the understanding and actions contemplated under this MOU. Such Newshound Student Facilitator shall take all actions relevant and necessary to ensure that Newshound and/or the Student Journalists are not precluded, prohibited or stopped, in any manner, from having access to and utilizing the media and journalism facilities of the University in order to give effect to and complete, in a satisfactory manner, the actions contemplated hereunder.
 6. This MOU shall come into effect on the date of its execution and shall remain in full force and effect until such time as the Parties may mutually agree, in writing, or until such time as the termination hereof. It is also agreed between the Parties that this MOU can be terminated by either Party, by giving 1 (one) week's notice to the other Party, accompanied with reasons in writing, which reasons shall be reasonable, fair and non-discriminatory.
 7. Each of the Parties acknowledges that the Parties have entered into this MOU on the basis of the representations made by the other Party. In the event any Party becomes aware of any fact, matter or circumstance (whether existing on or before the date of this MOU or arising afterwards) which would cause any of the representations and warranties given by them, to become untrue or inaccurate or misleading in any material respect, it shall duly inform the other Party of the same, in writing.
 8. Both the parties can use logos of each other to exhibit the list of partners. No other use of logo will be allowed.

9. The reports by the students of the Institute shall not contain anything defamatory against the University/Institute/State Government/Central Government. IMC&MT will devise a mechanism to filter and route students' submission to Newshound. Newshound will not publish any report of students which are not routed through the Institute.
10. It is clearly agreed and understood by and between the Parties hereto that this understanding does not amount to a partnership or association of persons and each Party will carry out its own actions independently. It is expressly agreed that neither Party shall act as a deemed agent or principal of the other Party.
11. If any dispute or difference of any kind whatsoever arises between the Parties in connection with, or out of, this MOU, the Parties shall attempt to amicably resolve such disputes. If the dispute cannot be settled within 30 (thirty) days by mutual discussion, the Parties agree that the courts of Kurukshetra, India, shall have the jurisdiction to try and entertain any suit, claim or action arising out of this understanding.
12. Any provision of this MOU which is invalid or unenforceable shall be ineffective to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability, without affecting, in any manner, the remaining provisions hereof.
13. Each Party shall bear and pay its own costs and fees in relation to the execution of this MOU.
14. Each of the Parties hereto shall do and execute all further acts, deeds, matters and things as may reasonably be required of them to carry out and implement the terms and provisions of this MOU.
15. Each Party shall retain a signed and certified copy of this MOU.
16. Newshound India Foundation pledges to fund the training of all students from the Institute of Mass Communication and Media Technology, Kurukshetra University, for its 2021-22 session.
17. There is no financial liability on the part of Institute of Mass Communication and Media Technology, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra to take up any activity mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

Himachal Pradesh Corrugated Box Manufacturers Associations Plot No. 11A, Sector-2, Parwanoo, District Solan, H.P. the Second Party, and represented herein by its Zonal / Divisional Head, **Name of Competent Authority / Representative**, (hereinafter referred to as "**Second Party**", company which expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors – in-office, administrators and assigns).

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as '**Parties**' and individually as '**Party**')

WHEREAS:

- 1) First Party & Second Party will collaborate to promote effective use of mutual resources for enhanced opportunities for students.
- 2) The Parties intend to cooperate for Skill Based Training, Education and Research.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MOU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

CLAUSE 1 CO-OPERATION

- 1.1 Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the Institution and its related wings. - 2.2 **Curriculum Design:** Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching / training methodology for better training & placement of students.

- 2.3 **Industrial Training & Visits:** Industry and Institution interaction will give an insight into the latest developments / requirements of the industries; the Second Party to permit the Faculty and Students of the First Party to visit its group companies and also involve in Industrial Training Programs for the First Party. The industrial training and exposure provided to students and faculty through this association will build confidence and prepare the students to have a smooth transition from academic to working career. The Second Party will provide its Labs / Workshops / Industrial Sites for the hands-on training of the learners enrolled with the First Party.
- 2.4 **Internships and Placement of Students:** Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the Internship and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs.
- 2.5 **Research and Development:** Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the fields of – Printing and Packaging Technologies.
- 2.6 **Skill Development Programs:** Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gaps and make them industry ready.
- 2.7 **Expert Lectures:** Second Party to extend the necessary support to deliver expert lectures to the students of the First Party on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.8 **Faculty Development Programs:** Second Party to train the Faculties of First Party for imparting industrial exposure/ training as per the industrial requirement considering the National Occupational Standards in concerned sector, if available.
- 2.9 **Start ups/Entrepreneurship:** The second party will assist/guide the students for setting their own start ups and further will help them to be entrepreneur in their respective areas.

- 2.10 There is no financial commitment on the part of the **Institute of Mass Communication & Media Technology, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra**, the First Party, to take up any activity mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

CLAUSE 3 INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- 3.1 Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

CLAUSE 4 VALIDITY

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid initially for a period of 3 years. It can be extended further with mutual consent.
- 4.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar days' notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their existing obligations

PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION OF INDIA, NEW DELHI



COOPERATION AGREEMENT TO BE HELD ON THE ONE HAND BY DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION, KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, KURUKSHETRA REPRESENTED BY CHAIRPERSON OF DEPT. OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION, KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY, HEREAFTER REFERRED AS THE "KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY", AND ON THE OTHER, THE, PHYSICAL EDUCATION FOUNDATION OF INDIA, THROUGH THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION DEPARTMENT REPRESENTED BY ITS SECRETARY PIYUSH KUMAR JAIN, HEREAFTER REFERRED TO AS "PEFI", IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS SET FORTH HEREIN.

DECLARATIONS

FIRST.- KURUKSHETRA UNIVERSITY:

1. That, its legal address is Kurukshetra Haryana - 136119
2. That its participation in the execution of this agreement will be through the Department of Physical Education, Kurukshetra University.

SECOND.- Physical Education Foundation of India declares:

1. Is a NGO registered vide Number 4154 on Page No. 48 to 67 on this date 28/8/2008 for the promotion of Physical Education & Sports in India under the Trust Registration Act (Government of India) with registration Number 4154 on Dated 28th August 2013.
2. Its aim is to get Indian Healthy Fit and free from Diseases.
3. Mr. Piyush Kumar Jain as Secretary, authorized for the legal work and signing of MOU for the foundation up to 29th August 2025 and its legal residence is located at 7/26, KSK, Lower Ground Floor, Ansari Road, Daryaganj, New Delhi - 110002

The Agreement will be governed by the following clauses:

FIRST.- PURPOSE.- The present agreement aims to encourage and establish a collaboration network to generate knowledge exchange between the two signatory institutions in research, popularization and teaching in the areas of Physical Education, Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity.

SECOND.- SCOPE.- For the achievement of the subject of this agreement shall be carried out the following activities:

1. Generate popularization products between the institutions, which benefit the academic programs that drive this agreement.
2. Promote short and long duration mobility academic exchange of teacher-researchers in teaching presence (face-to-face) or virtual manner: subjects, modules, units or specific topics, according to the possibilities of each academic institution's resource exchange policies.
3. Promote students' academic mobility to study a semester, specific subjects, or to perform social service or professional practice in institutions or companies authorized by the receiving institution.
4. Negotiate for the development of research and the dissemination of the same in international and national organizations.
5. Promote lecturers exchange in academic events programmed by the signatory institutions, as well as, the accomplishment of seminars and training courses, either personally or through videoconferences.

THIRD.-WORK PROGRAMMES.- The following priority areas of work has been established:

Teaching. The pooling of specialist teachers in presence and/or virtual form of Physical Education, Recreation, Sport and Physical Activities destined to the following topics: theories and currents of PE, didactics, exercise physiology, sports training, disability, gymnastics, theory's game, sports, activities in the natural environment, camps and research seminars.

Research. Four priority lines of research production will be established:

1. Physical Education, Body, Culture and Activity. Senses and culture in India.
2. Teaching Physical Education. Game, gymnastics, physical activity, leisure, recreation, and sport, practices and speeches of the body in physical education.
3. Sport and Society. The Hindu and Mexican citizenship and sport: institutions, social organizations, new sports activities, sports industries, professional sports, media and sports, etc.
4. Education, disability and inclusion. Vocational training, motor skills development, special didactics and outstanding skills.

FOURTH - COMMITMENTS OF THE PARTIES.- The signatory parties of the present document will collaborate at all times, in accordance with the principles of good faith and effectiveness, to ensure the proper execution of the agreement and to encourage and promote the cultural, scientific, academic and technological development of the academic programs of the signatory institutions.

FIFTH - COMMISSION OF AGREEMENTS.- A Monitoring Committee will be created for the implementation, control and monitoring of the activities foreseen in this Agreement; by the Chairperson, Department of Physical Education and Physical Education Foundation of India, Secretary Piyush Jain; both parties will be responsible for the following functions:

- * To plan, promote, monitor and evaluate programs and actions to be undertaken under this Agreement.
- * To establish the internal rules of the Monitoring Committee, in accordance with the Statutes of the signatories.
- * To create subcommittees that were relevant to the development of the various programs of action.

SIXTH - VALIDITY - This instrument will be valid for three years from the date of its signature. However, the parties may terminate early, for which the interested party shall notify the other party in writing, within thirty days of anticipation, on the understanding that the parties undertake to comply with all the obligations agreed that are pending completion and which are in development.

SEVENTH - MODIFICATIONS.- The present Agreement may be amended or supplemented by agreement of the parties provided they are in writing. Modifications or additions oblige signatories from the date of signature, on the understanding that they will have the sole purpose of improving and contributing to the fulfillment of the purpose of this agreement.

EIGHTH - INTERPRETATION.- The conditions of this Agreement constitute the entirety of the agreement between the parties, and represent the complete integration and final expression of the agreement between them regarding the matter stated therein.

It is understood that the implementation of this Memorandum of Understanding will commence on the day of signature, and will continue thereafter for five years, subject to revision or modification from time to time by mutual agreement. For renewal, the representative from both institutions will discuss the terms at least six months prior to the natural termination of the current Memorandum of Understanding. The conflict of interest, if any, can be decided by the mutual consultations.

It extends this cooperation agreement in place and date indicated below and is signed in duplicate by the legal representatives of the parties concerned in accordance with the content, retaining a copy in each.

The Committee was apprised that the decreasing trend of interest rate by the banks on Endowment Funds is still going on and it is very difficult on the part of the University to make the payment of Scholarships/Medals/Prizes out of the interest accrued on the Endowment funds. Hence, the Committee recommends that the Scholarships/Medals/Prizes placed at Annexure-A (pages 1-4) be kept in Abeyance for a period of further 5 years i.e. 2022-23 to 2026-27.

The Committee also recommends the following:-

1. All the Scholarships/Medals/Prizes at Annexure 'B' which are being awarded against the Endowment Funds of less than Rs.2.00 Lac may also be kept in abeyance for a period of five years w.e.f. the session 2022-23 to 2026-27.
2. New Scholarships/Medals/Prizes be instituted only when the amount of Rs.5 Lac is donated as Endowment Fund.
3. 8% interest annually earned on the Endowments be used for award of Scholarships/Medals/Prizes and remaining 2% interest may be used for University Expenses in the new Endowments made by the Donors.
4. If, any Donor wants to increase the Endowment given at Annexure-A (pages 1-4) and Annexure-B to Rs.3 Lac or more by depositing the remaining amount, the Scholarships/Medals/ Prizes will be started by increasing the Endowment amount upto Rs.3 Lac by the concerned Donor.
5. If any donor wants to award the Scholarship on annual basis then, minimum amount Rs.9000/- may be deposited by the Donor regularly with the University every year.
