The length of the full paper should be between 3500-5000 words. Contributors will use Times New Roman font. Font size should be 16 points for the title, 12 points for rest of the text, spacing 1.5, margin of One (1) inch on all sides and text should be justified.
- 3. References should be provided using 'American Psychological Association' (APA) Style.
- 4. Submitted papers must not have been previously presented, published, accepted for publication and it should be free from plagiarism.
- 5. If the paper gets accepted, at least one author will register and present the paper online in the seminar and submit the copyright form.
- 6. Authors should provide a brief biographical note clearly indicating full name, designation, affiliation & contact details.
- 7. Kindly indicate the name of the corresponding author in case of two or more authors.
