Annual Report -2022

The office of Dean Students' Welfare facilitates student empowerment, leadership, and advocacy by strengthening student participation in the life, governance and success of the University. The office provides resources and support to help students turn their ideas into reality. The office works for engaging the students to let them harness their energy for constructive creativity and to further empower themselves by sharpening their skills as well as inculcating leadership capabilities transforming themselves into positive catalysts for personal and National growth. The office looks after students' welfare in different ways and promotes various cultural, sports and academic activities.

1. <u>Bus/Railway passes facility to the students</u>

One of the major activities of the office is to facilitate students to travel to the University and back. The office as such arranged 4152 bus passes and 324 railway passes for the students of University Teaching Departments (UTD) in 2022. The work involves various processes, such as online data entry of students on the Haryana Roadways website, cash collection, deposit, preparation and distribution of passes. In case of railway concessions, the office of D.S.W. disbursed the concession forms supplied by DRM, New Delhi, to the eligible students. The facility of providing bus and railway passes has been made very smooth and time bound in the last years.

2. Earn While You Learn Scheme

This novel scheme provides financial assistance to upto 50 UTD students in the form of their engagement for Department related work upto 18 hours a week @ Rs. 60/- per hour. The meritorious students, not possessing financial resources to fund their education are selected on the recommendations of the Chairperson of respective departments. The spirit of the scheme is based on the idea of enabling needy students to meet their educational expenses with dignity. Total 13 students have received engagement letters under this scheme in session 2022-23.

3. Financial aid to differently abled students

Every year, the office of the Dean Students' Welfare provides financial aid @Rs. 4,000/(per student) to the needy and physically challenged students. In session 2022-23, the aid was provided to 16 students. Most of the buildings entrance has been provided with ramp engaging hassle free entrance to differently abled persons.

4. <u>Funding of Educational/Cultural Tours</u>

Students are encouraged to undertake trips and tours to places of educational and historical importance. In addition to their academic relevance, these trips develop leadership qualities, promote team work and develop an attitude of cooperation among

students. The trips are also expected to sensitize the students to appreciate other cultures, societies and languages. The office funded 34 tours during the year 2022.

5. Funding for Inter-Disciplinary, Guest Lectures & Co-Curricular activities

The office of D.S.W. provides financial assistance for arranging guest lectures, extension lectures and other inter-disciplinary lectures of outside experts in different University Teaching Departments for the sake of exposing our students to multitude of ideas. In the year 2022, the office of DSW provided funds for 14 lectures.

6. Rostrum Competitions

The office of the Dean Students' Welfare has been organizing Rostrum, Annual Public Speaking Competition, since 2005. Over the years, these competitions have generated lot of interest amongst the students and faculty. These public speaking competitions are conducted at the department, faculty and University levels. The process of the competition for the session 2022-23 is under process.

7. Common Rooms

Separate Common Rooms for boys and girls are maintained at several places on the campus. In these rooms, newspapers, magazines and other equipment are provided to the students.

8. Subhash Sadan

The Subhash Sadan (Students' Home) is maintained for providing a venue for gettogether and other programmes of students. Students' Home was provided to the students for such diverse programmes of discussions and other cultural events etc. Community Centre & R. K. Sadan are also provided to the students, if need arises.

9. **Group Insurance Scheme for the Students**

The Kurukshetra University is running Group Insurance Scheme for students of the University whereby all the regular students are insured for Rs. 2,00,000/- for a token premium @Rs. 12/- per student. An amount of Rs. 1,12,100/- was spent as insurance premium for the students during the session 2022-23.

10. Answer Books for Internal Tests

This office provides answer books to all the Teaching Departments/Institutes for internal tests of the students. The answer books (8 pages) are got printed from the University Press on requirement basis.

11. 16th National Youth Parliament Competion-2022

16th National Youth Parliament Group Level Competition was organized by the Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on 11.03.2022 in the Faculty Lounge. The event was presided over by Prof. Som Nath Sachdeva, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra, where Chief Guest Sh. Nayab Singh, Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Lok Sabha, Guest of Honour Prof. Rajbir Singh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor,

MDU Rohtak, Group Coordinator Prof. S.P. Singh, Dean, Chanakya National Law University, Patna and Dr. Sanjeev Sharma, Registrar, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra along with Coordinator Prof. Anil Kumar Vashisth and Associate Coordinator Dr. Neeraj Batish were present.

The event began with the formal welcome by the Coordinator Prof. Anil Vashisth. He also introduced the nature and importance of the competition to the guests and the participants. The event was inaugurated by lighting of the lamp by the esteemed guests. The session of the competition began at 11:39AM and lasted for 54 minutes. 55 students from the various departments of the University participated in the capacity of different office bearers and guests in the Youth Parliament. The session began with oath taking ceremony of a newly elected member and was followed by an obituary to late member Ms. Lata Mangeshkar. Many different issues including National Education Policy, religious conversion, economic fugitive offenders, Hijab and dress code, space junk, marital rape, official secrecy and confidentiality, Asha Worker etc. were taken up and discussed in detail during the various motions of the parliament. The guests were very much impressed with actual foreign students of the University playing the role of foreign delegates.

After the end of the session for the day, Prof. S.P. Singh shared his experience with the participants and the audience and also suggested valuable tips for future competitions. Prof. Rajbir Singh expressed his wonderful experience of the event by blessing the students of his Alma matter. Sh. Nayab Singh Saini, in his address, talked of the actual sittings and sessions of the parliament and waste if those could be as useful and academically high as demonstrated by the young participants.





Prof. Som Nath Sachdeva expressed his thankfulness to the dignitaries present for sparing their time and motivated the participants for more such eventful participations in future. Dr. Sanjeev Sharma delivered the formal vote of thanks. The proceedings of the programme were conducted by Dr. Neeraj Batish. 13. <u>Cultural activities</u>

The DSW office manages the participation of students of University Teaching Departments' teams in various activities of the University. Teams of students are selected to participate in these functions. The Dean Students' Welfare as Vice-Chairman of the

Kurukshetra University Cultural Council also monitors the smooth functioning of the University's cultural activities.

- A Talent Show Competition-2022 for the students of UTDs was organized by the office of DSW on 11th and 12th October, 2022. Total 400 students registered and participated in the 9 events (Speech, Singing, Dance, Mono-Acting, Painting, Poetical Symposium, Mimicry, Quiz & Playing Instruments). The winners of each event were awarded a cash prize of Rs. 600/- (1st), 500/- (2nd) & 400/- (3rd) along with certificates.
- Haryana Day State Level Fest-2022 at Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra (28th October to 31th October 2022). Total 107 students of UTD participated in Haryana Day (Ratnawali)-2022 in 26 events. We won a total of 13 prizes in various events: 1st prize in Fine Arts Exhibition, Haryanvi Solo Dance Female, Haryanvi Group Song, Haryanvi Orchestra, Haryanvi Gazal; 2nd prize in On the Spot Painting Competition, Haryanvi Group Dance and Haryanvi Duet Raagni; 3rd prize in Rasiya Dance, Haryanvi Folk Solo Instrument and Haryanvi Short Film and 5th prize in Haryanvi Bhajan and Haryanvi mono-acting.
- Inter Zonal Youth Festival-2022: Total 154 UTD students participated in 40 events and won a total of 24 prizes in various events. Recommended (7) in, Classical Solo Dance, Classical Vocal Solo, Classical Instrument Solo (Taalvadya), Classical Instrument Solo (Swar-Vadya), Group Song (Haryanvi), Poetical Symposium, Western Instrument Solo); Commended (6) in Quiz, Debate, Haryanvi Group Dance, Folk Instrument Haryanvi Solo, Western Vocal Solo, On The Spot Painting). Won 3rd prize in 10 events (Poster Making, Rangoli, Sanskrit Drama, Haryanvi Solo Dance (Male), Rasiya Dance Folk Song (General) Solo, Collage, Haryanvi Solo Dance (Female), Orchestra Indian, Group Song (Western).

14. N.S.S. Activities

The NSS UTD Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra works very actively under the office of the Dean Students' Welfare. It has four different Units with strength of approximately five hundred plus volunteers, working under the supervision of their respective Programme Officers namely Dr. Raj Kamal, Dr. Dipti Chaudhary, Dr. Manisha Sandhu and Dr. Sunil Kumar. A number of activities were performed (online/offline) by volunteers throughout the year. The participation by the youth in various social service activities is a matter of pride for the university.

a. Volunteers participated in the NSS day event on 24.09.2022 organized at university level. In this event NSS (UTD) represented the various activities of last year in the form of poster presentation. Chief Guest of the event recognizes the contribution of the NSS (UTD) and presents the certificate of appreciation on this occasion to the programme officer of the UTD.





- b. One day camp was organized by NSS (UTD), Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on the occasion of National Nutrition Month under the theme:
 - (i) Women and Health
 - (ii) Child and Education Nutrition with Education

NSS volunteers participated in this camp with great zeal and enthusiasm. Poster making competition and quiz contest was conducted on the occasion.

c. Under the guidance of Dean Students Welfare and as per the direction received from Regional Directorate of NSS, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, New Delhi, a Mega Swachhata Drive was organized by NSS UTD, KUK on dated 19.10.2022 as a one-day activity. NSS volunteers carried out the cleanliness campaign in the University market area. They collected plastic waste from common gathering places of market and from the vicinity of food courts area. While collecting the plastic waste, volunteers also educated the shop-keepers and students regarding the effects of burning of plastic on the environment. Volunteers also encouraged the shop-keepers to avoid the single use plastic items in their day-to-day activities.

addressed the volunteers on the about the theme of the webinar and aware the students related to the animal rights.

- f. Above all it is a matter of pride that one of our NSS UTD volunteer Ms. Hamisha, Department of Chemistry represented NSS, UTD, KUK for Republic Day Parade on 26.01.2023.
- g. One Special Camp/ Seven days NSS camp is scheduled to be organized in the month of February 2023.

16. <u>Eco-Club Activities</u>

Eco Club, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra was formed under the guidance of Environmental Nodal Officer and Dean Student Welfare (DSW) Eco-club, Prof. Anil K Vashisth to promote and mange environmental protection activities on campus. Eco-club team members including teachers and students participate actively along with Environmental Nodal Officer to make KUK as a leading institution in maintaining its green campus and to contribute towards the society in different areas of environment protection. Under the able guidance of Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, Prof. Som Nath Sachdeva regular activities are being organized by the Eco club, KUK in collaboration with Paryavaran Sanrakshan Gatividhi (PSG) since January, 2021.

- Five students every month were recommended from the KUK for Social Internship Programme (SIP) organized at the national level by Paryavaran Sanrakshan Gatividhi (PSG). During this special training students learnt various aspects of environment conservation and trained students are called Eco-Commanders. Eco-Commanders further works to strengthen Eco club and motivate the society for maximum tree plantation, saving water and energy.
- Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra hosted a regional level event of National Environment Youth Parliament- (NEYP) 2022 "Nurturing Environment Leaders" as a regional host for all the Universities from Delhi and Haryana zone. University level National Environment Youth Parliament- (NEYP) 2022 was organized by the Eco-club, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra on 15th and 16th January, 2022 through online mode, in which students from affiliated colleges and UTD, KUK has participated and the winners from this competition has advanced to the Regional Level. This year, Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra was nominated as the Regional Host University for Delhi & Haryana Zone. The objective of conducting NEYP-2022 was to encourage and engage the youth with Environmental Issues and to obtain a resolution of their opinion on the Vision of New India towards Environment and Sustainability. On 23rd January, 2022 the regional phase of National Environment Youth Parliament-2022 was organized through virtual mode under the joint aegis of Kurukshetra University, Kurukshetra and Paryavaran Sanrakshan Gatividhi on the occasion of birth Anniversary of Neta Ji Subhash Chandra Bose. National Convener of Environment Activities Sh. Gopal Arya was the Chief Guest of the programme. The event witnessed participation of students from different universities of Haryana and Delhi. The jury members included reputed Eminent Political Leader, Eminent Journalist, Environmentalist and academician of repute. Group discussion on the topic "Air pollution and its mitigation" was organized as a part of the event. A total of 121 students were a part of the finale from 16 participating universities of Delhi &

Haryana zone and 10 students were selected as winners, who have been participated at the National Level. The criteria for the selection of participants were research & content, oration & articulation, diplomacy demeanour and clarity of thoughts. It is a matter of pride that from our university two students name Ms. Riya malik, LLB first professional, Department of Law and Ms. Neha Sharma from Mata Sundri Khalsa Girls College, Karnal were selected for National level Grand finale held on 15th & 16th April in Parliament House, New Delhi.

• An online One day University Level Conference On "Vayu: The Vital Life Force" was organized by Eco-club, Kurukshetra University Kurukshetra on 19th September, 2022. The conference was organized at University level among the students from UTD/IIHS/UIET/ITTR/Affiliated colleges through virtual/online mode.
