3. (a) Examine the powers and functions of Election Commission of India.
(b) Need of Administrative Tribunal.

4. Discuss the powers, privileges and immunities of the members of Parliament.

7. (a) Discuss the effects of national emergency.
(b) The Governor of a state dissolved the state assembly on the advice of the Chief Minister retaining him as the Chief Minister till fresh election was held. The Governor acted without consulting the centre. The Central Government did not approve Governor's action and imposed President's rule. The justiciability of President's rule is challenged. Decide.
